16	<u>§ 8310. Emergency Addiction Treatment Program.</u>		
17	(a) EstablishmentThe Emergency Addiction Treatment		
18	Program is established in the Department of Drug and Alcohol		
19	Programs to provide addiction treatment in licensed long-term		
20	residential addiction treatment facilities, including licensed		
21	halfway houses, for individuals who are unable to obtain timely		
22	or appropriate treatment, as determined by the department, and		
23	to establish such treatment facilities. The program shall be		
24	administered by the department.		
25	(b) Powers and duties of departmentIn order to provide		
26	individuals seeking assistance with better and more timely		
27	access to drug and alcohol addiction treatment, the department		
28	<u>shall:</u>		
29	(1) Maintain a toll-free telephone number to assist		
30	individuals seeking help for drug and alcohol problems. The		
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1	telephone number shall be posted on the department's publicly
2	accessible Internet website and shall be posted or published
3	by the department in such other media as the department
4	determines is necessary to reach as many individuals as
5	possible.
6	(2) Provide assistance in accessing addiction treatment.
7	The department may provide this service by contract.
8	(3) Develop and maintain a database identifying problems
9	and patterns in accessing appropriate addiction treatment.
10	(4) Develop and provide a program to educate and counsel
11	families with addiction problems on how to prevent and treat
12	addiction.
13	(5) Prepare an annual report to the General Assembly on
14	the activities described in paragraphs (1), (2) and (3),
15	including recommendations for improving access to addiction
16	treatment. The report shall be posted on the department's
17	publicly accessible Internet website.
18	(c) GuidelinesThe department shall develop and forward to
19	the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the
20	Pennsylvania Bulletin guidelines for the implementation of the
21	program established under section 1203-B of the act of March 4,
22	1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, and to
23	govern the eligible use of the fund by counties and other
24	entities or persons that provide addiction treatment services to
25	individuals in licensed long-term residential addiction
26	treatment facilities, including halfway houses.
27	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
