AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 21, 1937 (P.L.774, No.211), entitled "An 1 act to facilitate vehicular traffic between the eastern and 2 western sections of the Commonwealth by providing for the 3 construction, operation and maintenance of a turnpike from a point at or near Middlesex in Cumberland County to a point at 5 or near Irwin in Westmoreland County; providing for the 6 creation of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission, and 7 conferring powers and imposing duties on said commission; 8 9 authorizing the issuance of turnpike revenue bonds of the Commonwealth, payable solely from tolls, to pay the cost of 10 such turnpike; providing that no debt of the Commonwealth 11 shall be incurred in the exercise of any of the powers 12 granted by this act; providing for the collection of tolls 13 for the payment of such bonds and for the cost of 14 maintenance, operation and repair of the turnpike; making 15 such bonds exempt from taxation; constituting such bonds 16 17 legal investments in certain instances; prescribing conditions upon which such turnpike shall become free; 18 19 providing for condemnation; granting certain powers and authority to municipal subdivisions and agencies of the 20 Commonwealth to cooperate with the commission; and 21 authorizing the issuance of turnpike revenue refunding 22 23 bonds," providing for reduced toll rates for disabled 24 veterans. 25 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 26 hereby enacts as follows: 27 Section 1. The act of May 21, 1937 (P.L.774, No.211),
- 28 referred to as the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission Act, is

- 1 amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 Section 5.4. (a) A disabled veteran shall receive a fifty
- 3 per centum reduction in the electronic toll rate for the use of
- 4 the turnpike. To qualify for the reduced toll rate, the disabled
- 5 <u>veteran must:</u>
- 6 (1) Be a resident of this Commonwealth.
- 7 (2) Have a valid electronic transponder issued by the
- 8 commission.
- 9 (3) Submit a commission-approved application for approval of
- 10 the toll reduction.
- 11 (4) Submit documentation of a disability incurred in any war
- 12 or armed conflict that consists of the loss of one or more
- 13 <u>limbs, the loss of the use of one or more limbs or total</u>
- 14 <u>blindness or is certified by the United States Department of</u>
- 15 <u>Veterans Affairs as fifty per centum disabled.</u>
- 16 (5) Sign a statement submitting that the veteran will not be
- 17 involved in fraudulent activities as defined by the commission.
- 18 A violation of the statement by the veteran may result in loss
- 19 of electronic transponder privileges.
- 20 (b) The commission shall have thirty days from the effective
- 21 date of this section to publish the application and guidance
- 22 necessary to implement this section. Following the submission of
- 23 a completed application, the commission shall have forty-five
- 24 days to determine the approval of an application.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
