A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, providing for congressional
- districts and further providing for the Legislative
- 4 Reapportionment Commission for the purpose of reapportioning
- and redistricting the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby resolves as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The following integrated amendments to the
- 9 Constitution of Pennsylvania are proposed in accordance with
- 10 Article XI:
- 11 (1) That Article II be amended by adding a section to read:
- 12 § 16.1. Congressional districts.
- 13 (a) Not later than October 1 of each year ending in one, the
- 14 General Assembly shall pass a congressional redistricting plan
- 15 by a three-fifths vote and the congressional redistricting plan
- 16 <u>shall be approved by the Governor.</u>
- (b) If a congressional redistricting plan is not approved by
- 18 the Governor and the General Assembly under subsection (a), the
- 19 following shall apply:

- 1 (1) Not later than November 15 of each year ending in one,
- 2 the Legislative and Congressional Redistricting Commission shall
- 3 <u>complete and approve a preliminary congressional redistricting</u>
- 4 plan and maps as provided under section 17 and make the
- 5 preliminary plan and maps available to the public in a manner
- 6 prescribed by law.
- 7 (2) The Legislative and Congressional Redistricting
- 8 Commission, within 30 days following the deadline for approval
- 9 of a preliminary congressional plan under paragraph (1), shall
- 10 schedule and conduct at least four public hearings in different
- 11 geographic regions of this Commonwealth on the preliminary plan.
- 12 (3) Not later than January 15 of each year ending in two,
- 13 the Legislative and Congressional Redistricting Commission shall
- 14 approve a final congressional redistricting plan. Upon approval,
- 15 the Legislative and Congressional Redistricting Commission shall
- 16 certify the resulting plan to the Secretary of the Commonwealth
- 17 and that plan shall constitute the certified final congressional
- 18 redistricting plan.
- 19 (4) If the Legislative and Congressional Redistricting
- 20 Commission does not approve a final congressional redistricting
- 21 plan by January 15 of each year ending in two, the Secretary of
- 22 the Commonwealth shall immediately proceed with the procedure
- 23 provided under section 17(o).
- 24 (2) That section 17 of Article II be amended to read:
- 25 § 17. Legislative [Reapportionment] and Congressional
- 26 Redistricting Commission.
- 27 (a) [In each year following the year of the Federal
- 28 decennial census] Not later than December 31 of each year ending
- 29 <u>in zero</u>, a Legislative [Reapportionment] <u>and Congressional</u>
- 30 Redistricting Commission shall be constituted for the purpose of

- 1 [reapportioning] redistricting the Commonwealth. The commission
- 2 shall [act by a majority of its entire membership.
- 3 (b) The commission shall consist of five members: four of
- 4 whom shall be the majority and minority leaders of both the
- 5 Senate and the House of Representatives, or deputies appointed
- 6 by each of them, and a chairman selected as hereinafter
- 7 provided. No later than 60 days following the official reporting
- 8 of the Federal census as required by Federal law, the four
- 9 members shall be certified by the President pro tempore of the
- 10 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives to the
- 11 elections officer of the Commonwealth who under law shall have
- 12 supervision over elections.
- The four members within 45 days after their certification
- 14 shall select the fifth member, who shall serve as chairman of
- 15 the commission, and shall immediately certify his name to such
- 16 elections officer. The chairman shall be a citizen of the
- 17 Commonwealth other than a local, State or Federal official
- 18 holding an office to which compensation is attached.
- 19 If the four members fail to select the fifth member within
- 20 the time prescribed, a majority of the entire membership of the
- 21 Supreme Court within 30 days thereafter shall appoint the
- 22 chairman as aforesaid and certify his appointment to such
- 23 elections officer.
- Any vacancy in the commission shall be filled within 15 days
- 25 in the same manner in which such position was originally filled.
- 26 (c) No later than 90 days after either the commission has
- 27 been duly certified or the population data for the Commonwealth
- 28 as determined by the Federal census are available, whichever is
- 29 later in time, the commission shall file a preliminary
- 30 reapportionment plan with such elections officer.

- The commission shall have 30 days after filing the
- 2 preliminary plan to make corrections in the plan.
- Any person aggrieved by the preliminary plan shall have the
- 4 same 30-day period to file exceptions with the commission in
- 5 which case the commission shall have 30 days after the date the
- 6 exceptions were filed to prepare and file with such elections
- 7 officer a revised reapportionment plan. If no exceptions are
- 8 filed within 30 days, or if filed and acted upon, the
- 9 commission's plan shall be final and have the force of law.
- (d) Any aggrieved person may file an appeal from the final
- 11 plan directly to the Supreme Court within 30 days after the
- 12 filing thereof. If the appellant establishes that the final plan
- 13 is contrary to law, the Supreme Court shall issue an order
- 14 remanding the plan to the commission and directing the
- 15 commission to reapportion the Commonwealth in a manner not
- 16 inconsistent with such order.
- (e) When the Supreme Court has finally decided an appeal or
- 18 when the last day for filing an appeal has passed with no appeal
- 19 taken, the reapportionment plan shall have the force of law and
- 20 the districts therein provided shall be used thereafter in
- 21 elections to the General Assembly until the next reapportionment
- 22 as required under this section 17.
- (f) Any district which does not include the residence from
- 24 which a member of the Senate was elected whether or not
- 25 scheduled for election at the next general election shall elect
- 26 a Senator at such election.
- 27 (g) The General Assembly shall appropriate sufficient funds
- 28 for the compensation and expenses of members and staff appointed
- 29 by the commission, and other necessary expenses. The members of
- 30 the commission shall be entitled to such compensation for their

- 1 services as the General Assembly from time to time shall
- 2 determine, but no part thereof shall be paid until a preliminary
- 3 plan is filed. If a preliminary plan is filed but the commission
- 4 fails to file a revised or final plan within the time
- 5 prescribed, the commission members shall forfeit all right to
- 6 compensation not paid.
- 7 (h) If a preliminary, revised or final reapportionment plan
- 8 is not filed by the commission within the time prescribed by
- 9 this section, unless the time be extended by the Supreme Court
- 10 for cause shown, the Supreme Court shall immediately proceed on
- 11 its own motion to reapportion the Commonwealth.
- (i) Any reapportionment plan filed by the commission, or
- 13 ordered or prepared by the Supreme Court upon the failure of the
- 14 commission to act, shall be published by the elections officer
- 15 once in at least one newspaper of general circulation in each
- 16 senatorial and representative district. The publication shall
- 17 contain a map of the Commonwealth showing the complete
- 18 reapportionment of the General Assembly by districts, and a map
- 19 showing the reapportionment districts in the area normally
- 20 served by the newspaper in which the publication is made. The
- 21 publication shall also state the population of the senatorial
- 22 and representative districts having the smallest and largest
- 23 population and the percentage variation of such districts from
- 24 the average population for senatorial and representative
- 25 districts.]:
- 26 (1) Conduct an open and transparent process enabling full
- 27 <u>public consideration of and comment on the drawing of district</u>
- 28 lines as required by this section.
- 29 (2) Draw district lines according to the redistricting
- 30 criteria specified in this section.

- 1 (3) Conduct itself with integrity and fairness.
- 2 (b) The commission shall consist of 11 members, as follows:
- 3 four who are registered with the largest political party in this
- 4 Commonwealth based on registration, four who are registered with
- 5 the second-largest political party in this Commonwealth based on
- 6 registration and three who are not registered with either of the
- 7 two largest political parties in this Commonwealth based on
- 8 registration.
- 9 <u>(c) Each commission member shall possess all of the</u>
- 10 following qualifications, in addition to any qualifications
- 11 prescribed by law:
- 12 (1) Be a voter who has been continuously registered in this
- 13 Commonwealth with the same political party or unaffiliated with
- 14 <u>a political party or political body and whose political</u>
- 15 <u>affiliation has not changed in the three years immediately</u>
- 16 preceding the date of appointment to the commission.
- 17 (2) Has voted in two of the last three Statewide general
- 18 elections immediately preceding the date of appointment to the
- 19 commission.
- 20 (3) Has not held or does not have an immediate family member
- 21 who has held elective public office at the Federal or State
- 22 level or elective judicial office in this Commonwealth in the
- 23 five years immediately preceding the date of appointment to the
- 24 commission.
- 25 (4) Has not served or does not have a spouse who has served
- 26 as a paid staff member or paid consultant to Congress, the
- 27 General Assembly or staff appointed by the Governor in the five
- 28 years immediately preceding the date of appointment to the
- 29 commission.
- 30 (5) Has not registered or does not have a spouse who has

- 1 registered as a Federal or State lobbyist in this Commonwealth
- 2 in the five years immediately preceding the date of appointment
- 3 to the commission.
- 4 (6) Has not been nominated or does not have a spouse who has
- 5 been nominated as a candidate for elective office by a political
- 6 party or political body or served or does not have a spouse who
- 7 <u>has served as a paid staff member or officer of a political</u>
- 8 party, political body, political committee or political action
- 9 committee in the five years immediately preceding the date of
- 10 appointment to the commission.
- 11 (d) Application and selection of the members of the
- 12 commission shall be subject to the following:
- 13 (1) Application to serve as a member of the commission may
- 14 be filed with, and on a form developed by, the Secretary of the
- 15 Commonwealth indicating thereon evidence of his or her
- 16 qualifications as provided by this section.
- 17 (2) The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall verify the
- 18 qualifications of each applicant. If the Secretary of the
- 19 Commonwealth finds that an applicant is not qualified, the
- 20 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall not include the applicant's
- 21 <u>name in the pool of applicants.</u>
- 22 (3) The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall separate all
- 23 qualified applicants into three subpools consisting of those who
- 24 are:
- 25 (i) registered with the largest political party in this
- 26 Commonwealth based on registration;
- 27 (ii) registered with the second-largest political party in
- 28 this Commonwealth based on registration; and
- 29 <u>(iii) not registered with either of the two largest</u>
- 30 political parties in this Commonwealth based on registration.

- 1 (4) The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall select, on a
- 2 random basis, 40 qualified applicants from each of the three
- 3 subpools provided in paragraph (3). The Majority Leader and
- 4 Minority Leader of the Senate and the Majority Leader and
- 5 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives may each strike
- 6 up to two applicants from each subpool. Each leader shall have
- 7 no more than six strikes.
- 8 (5) After the legislative leaders have exercised their
- 9 strikes under paragraph (4), the Secretary of the Commonwealth
- 10 <u>shall select for appointment as members of the commission on a</u>
- 11 random basis from the remaining applicants in each of the three
- 12 <u>subpools of qualified applicants. In addition to the</u>
- 13 qualification requirements provided in subsection (c),
- 14 appointments from each subpool shall reasonably reflect the
- 15 racial, geographic and gender diversity of this Commonwealth.
- 16 (6) One of the members shall be selected as chair by a vote
- 17 of at least six members of the commission.
- 18 (e) The term of office of each member of the commission
- 19 shall expire at the same time the commission expires as provided
- 20 in this section.
- 21 (f) Removal of a member and vacancies on the commission
- 22 shall be subject to the following:
- 23 (1) If a member of the commission fails to attend more than
- 24 two consecutive meetings at which a vote of the commission is
- 25 scheduled, the member's position shall be deemed vacant unless
- 26 the member is absent due to death of an immediate family member,
- 27 personal illness or illness of an immediate family member.
- 28 (2) If a member of the commission has been convicted, found
- 29 quilty or pled quilty or nolo contendere to embezzlement of
- 30 public money, bribery, perjury or other infamous crime, whether

- 1 or not sentence has been imposed, the member's position shall be
- 2 <u>deemed vacant</u>.
- 3 (3) A vacancy in the commission shall be filled within 14
- 4 days from the time the commission is notified of the vacancy in
- 5 the same manner that the position was originally filled and
- 6 using the same pool of applicants from which the vacating member
- 7 was chosen. If none of those remaining applicants are available
- 8 for service, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall fill the
- 9 <u>vacancy from a new pool of applicants created from the same</u>
- 10 voter registration category as the vacating member.
- 11 (g) A member shall be ineligible to do the following for a
- 12 period of three years beginning from the expiration of the term
- 13 for which the member was appointed to the commission:
- 14 (1) Serve as a paid staff member or paid consultant to
- 15 Congress, the General Assembly or staff appointed by the
- 16 Governor.
- 17 (2) Register as a Federal or State lobbyist in this
- 18 Commonwealth.
- 19 (3) Serve as a paid staff member or paid political
- 20 consultant for a political party, political body, political
- 21 committee or political action committee.
- (h) A member and the member's spouse shall be ineligible to
- 23 do the following for a period of five years beginning from the
- 24 expiration of the term for which the member was appointed to the
- 25 commission:
- 26 (1) Hold an appointed position or elective public office at
- 27 <u>the Federal or State level in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 28 (2) Be nominated or circulate petitions to be nominated as a
- 29 candidate for elective office by a political party or political
- 30 body.

- 1 (3) Hold office for a political party, political body,
- 2 political committee or political action committee.
- 3 (i) Seven members of the commission shall constitute a
- 4 quorum. Seven or more affirmative votes shall be required for
- 5 any official action. The final redistricting plan must be
- 6 approved by at least seven affirmative votes that must include
- 7 <u>at least one vote of a member registered from each of the two</u>
- 8 <u>largest political parties in this Commonwealth based on</u>
- 9 <u>registration and one vote from a member who is not registered</u>
- 10 with either of the two largest political parties.
- 11 (j) To begin the process of preparing information necessary
- 12 to the redistricting process, the commission shall:
- 13 (1) Acquire all necessary and appropriate information,
- 14 <u>review and evaluate available facilities and develop programs</u>
- 15 and procedures, that may include the use of software, in
- 16 preparation for drawing redistricting plans on the basis of each
- 17 Federal census. The commission shall make the information
- 18 available to the public in a manner prescribed by law.
- 19 (2) As soon as possible after December 31 of each year
- 20 ending in zero, obtain from the United States Census Bureau the
- 21 population data needed for redistricting that the Census Bureau
- 22 is required to provide the Commonwealth under 13 U.S.C. § 141
- 23 (relating to population and other census information) and use
- 24 that data to assign a population figure based upon census data
- 25 to each geographic and political unit described pursuant to
- 26 subparagraph (i). Upon completing that task, the commission
- 27 <u>shall begin the preparation of redistricting plans as required</u>
- 28 by this section. The commission shall use the data obtained to
- 29 <u>prepare:</u>
- 30 (i) Necessary descriptions of census blocks, voting

- 1 districts, wards, municipalities and counties for which census
- 2 data will be reported and that are suitable for use as
- 3 <u>components of districts.</u>
- 4 (ii) Maps of census blocks, voting districts, wards,
- 5 <u>municipalities and counties within this Commonwealth that may be</u>
- 6 used to illustrate the locations of district boundaries proposed
- 7 <u>in plans.</u>
- 8 (3) In establishing districts, the commission shall not
- 9 consider the following data:
- 10 (i) Addresses of any individual.
- 11 (ii) Political affiliations of registered voters.
- 12 (iii) Previous election results, unless required by Federal
- 13 <u>and State law.</u>
- 14 <u>(k) The commission shall establish districts pursuant to a</u>
- 15 mapping process in accordance with Federal and State law.
- (1) Each legislative redistricting plan drawn under this
- 17 section shall provide that any vacancy in the General Assembly
- 18 that is filled under the plan, occurring at a time that makes it
- 19 necessary to fill the vacancy at a special election held under
- 20 section 629 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known
- 21 as the Pennsylvania Election Code, shall be filled from the same
- 22 district that elected the senator or representative whose seat
- 23 is vacant.
- 24 (m) The commission, within 30 days prior to the deadline for
- 25 <u>approval of a preliminary legislative redistricting plan as</u>
- 26 provided in subsection (n)(1), shall schedule and conduct at
- 27 <u>least four public hearings in different geographic regions of</u>
- 28 this Commonwealth.
- 29 (m.1) All commission meetings that are attended or
- 30 participated in by a quorum of the members of the commission

- 1 held for the purpose of deliberating official business of taking
- 2 <u>official action shall be open to the public.</u>
- 3 (n) (1) Not later than July 1 of each year ending in one,
- 4 the commission shall complete and approve a preliminary
- 5 <u>legislative redistricting plan and maps as required under this</u>
- 6 section and make the preliminary legislative redistricting plan
- 7 and maps available to the public in a manner prescribed by law.
- 8 (2) The commission, within 30 days following the deadline
- 9 for approval of a preliminary legislative redistricting plan as
- 10 provided in paragraph (1), shall schedule and conduct at least
- 11 four public hearings, in different geographic regions of this
- 12 Commonwealth, on the preliminary legislative redistricting plan.
- 13 (3) Not later than August 15 of each year ending in one, the
- 14 commission shall approve a final legislative redistricting plan.
- 15 Upon approval, the commission shall certify the resulting plan
- 16 to the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and that legislative
- 17 redistricting plan shall constitute the certified final
- 18 <u>legislative redistricting plan.</u>
- 19 (4) If the commission fails to approve a final legislative
- 20 redistricting plan in accordance with paragraph (3), the
- 21 following shall apply:
- 22 (i) Not later than September 1 of each year ending in one,
- 23 the commission shall complete and approve a second preliminary
- 24 legislative redistricting plan and maps prepared in accordance
- 25 with subsections (i) and (k) and make the second preliminary
- 26 legislative redistricting plan and maps available to the public
- 27 <u>in a manner prescribed by law.</u>
- 28 (ii) Within 30 days following the deadline for approval of
- 29 the second preliminary legislative redistricting plan as
- 30 provided in subparagraph (i), the commission shall schedule and

- 1 conduct at least four public hearings, in different geographic
- 2 regions of this Commonwealth, on the second preliminary
- 3 <u>legislative redistricting plan.</u>
- 4 <u>(iii) Not later than October 15 of each year ending in one,</u>
- 5 the commission shall approve a final legislative redistricting
- 6 plan. Upon approval, the commission shall certify the resulting
- 7 <u>legislative redistricting plan to the Secretary of the</u>
- 8 Commonwealth, and that legislative redistricting plan shall
- 9 constitute the certified final legislative redistricting plan.
- 10 (o) If the commission does not complete and approve a final
- 11 <u>legislative redistricting plan by October 15 of each year ending</u>
- 12 <u>in one or a final congressional redistricting plan by January 15</u>
- of each year ending in two as required under section 16.1(b)(3),
- 14 the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall immediately petition the
- 15 Supreme Court for an order directing the appointment of a
- 16 <u>special master to develop and complete a final redistricting</u>
- 17 plan in accordance with the criteria and requirements provided
- 18 <u>in subsections (j) and (k). The special master must demonstrate</u>
- 19 expertise in geographic information systems by holding a
- 20 graduate degree in geographic information systems and currently
- 21 serving as a faculty member for a geographic information systems
- 22 program at an institution of higher learning located within this
- 23 Commonwealth and must meet the qualifications in subsection (c)
- 24 and be bound by the restrictions in subsections (q) and (h).
- 25 Upon the Supreme Court's approval of the master's plan, the
- 26 court shall certify the resulting plan to the Secretary of the
- 27 <u>Commonwealth</u>, and that plan shall constitute the certified final
- 28 plan.
- 29 (p) The commission has the sole legal standing to defend an
- 30 action regarding a certified final plan and shall inform the

- 1 General Assembly if it determines that funds or other resources
- 2 provided for the operation of the commission are not adequate.
- 3 (g) (1) The Supreme Court has original and exclusive
- 4 jurisdiction in all proceedings that a certified final plan is
- 5 <u>challenged or is claimed not to have taken timely effect.</u>
- 6 (2) An aggrieved person who is a registered voter in this
- 7 Commonwealth may file a petition with the Supreme Court within
- 8 30 days after the commission has certified a final plan to the
- 9 <u>Secretary of the Commonwealth to bar the Secretary of the</u>
- 10 Commonwealth from implementing the plan on the grounds that the
- 11 <u>filed plan violates the Constitution of the United States, the</u>
- 12 <u>Constitution of Pennsylvania or any Federal or State statute.</u>
- 13 <u>(r) The Department of State shall provide staff as needed to</u>
- 14 support the commission in the performance of its duties.
- 15 (s) Upon the filing of all redistricting plans required
- 16 <u>under this section and the exhaustion of all appeals of a</u>
- 17 redistricting plan:
- 18 (1) the commission shall expire and the commission's
- 19 responsibilities shall terminate; and
- 20 (2) the final plan shall have the force of law and the
- 21 districts provided in the plan shall be used thereafter in
- 22 elections to the General Assembly until the next redistricting
- 23 as required under this section.
- 24 (t) The General Assembly shall appropriate sufficient funds
- 25 for the compensation and expenses of members and staff appointed
- 26 by the commission and for other necessary expenses. In addition
- 27 to necessary expenses, the members of the commission shall
- 28 receive a per diem for each day or part of a day spent
- 29 performing their official duties. The per diem shall be the most
- 30 recent per diem rate for locations in this Commonwealth as

- 1 established and published by the United States General Services
- 2 Administration.
- 3 (u) A legislative district that does not include the
- 4 residence that a member of the Senate was elected, whether or
- 5 not scheduled for election at the next general election, shall
- 6 elect a Senator at the election.
- 7 <u>(v) The following words and phrases when used in this</u>
- 8 <u>section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection</u>
- 9 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 10 "Commission." The Legislative and Congressional
- 11 Redistricting Commission.
- 12 "Federal census." The decennial census required by Federal
- 13 law to be conducted by the United States Census Bureau in every
- 14 <u>year ending in zero.</u>
- "Immediate family." A parent, spouse, child, brother or
- 16 sister.
- 17 "Member." A member of the Legislative and Congressional
- 18 Redistricting Commission.
- 19 "Plan." A plan for legislative and congressional
- 20 redistricting drawn under the requirements of this section.
- 21 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 22 Assembly of these proposed constitutional amendments, the
- 23 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 24 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 25 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 26 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 27 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 28 passage of these proposed constitutional amendments.
- 29 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of these
- 30 proposed constitutional amendments, the Secretary of the

- 1 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 2 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 3 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 4 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 5 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 6 these proposed constitutional amendments. The Secretary of the
- 7 Commonwealth shall submit the proposed constitutional amendments
- 8 under section 1 of this resolution to the qualified electors of
- 9 this Commonwealth as a single ballot question at the first
- 10 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 11 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 12 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 13 three months after the proposed constitutional amendments are
- 14 passed by the General Assembly.
