AN ACT

Amending Titles 3 (Agriculture) and 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in nutrient 2 management and odor management, further providing for 3 declaration of legislative purpose, for definitions and for powers and duties of commission and repealing provisions 4 5 relating to Nutrient Management Advisory Board; and 7 establishing the Farm Animal Advisory Board. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 502(3) and (5) of Title 3 of the 11 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 12 § 502. Declaration of legislative purpose. 13 The purposes of this chapter are as follows: 14 15 To require the State Conservation Commission, in 16 conjunction with the Cooperative Extension Service of The 17 Pennsylvania State University, the Department of 18 Environmental Protection, the department and the [Nutrient 19 Management Advisory Board] Farm Animal Advisory Board to 20 develop and provide technical and financial assistance for 2.1 nutrient management and alternative uses of animal manure,

- including a manure marketing and distribution program.

- 3 (5) To require the State Conservation Commission, in
- 4 conjunction with the [Nutrient Management Advisory Board]
- 5 <u>Farm Animal Advisory Board</u>, to develop and administer a
- 6 regulatory program requiring odor management plans addressing
- 7 new and expanded animal housing facilities and manure
- 8 management facilities at concentrated animal operations and
- 9 concentrated animal feeding operations after July 19, 1993,
- 10 and to encourage the voluntary implementation of odor
- 11 management plans for other agricultural operations.

- The commission shall have the following powers and duties:

- 2 Section 4. Section 510 of Title 3 is repealed:
- 3 [§ 510. Nutrient Management Advisory Board.
- 4 (a) Creation. -- There is created the Nutrient Management
- 5 Advisory Board. The board shall consist of 16 members appointed
- 6 by the chairman of the commission and approved by a two-thirds
- 7 vote of the commission. The members so appointed shall consist
- 8 of five active commercial farm owners or operators representing
- 9 the livestock, swine, meat poultry, egg poultry and dairy
- 10 industry nominated by Statewide general farm organizations, one
- 11 veterinary nutrition specialist, one representative from the
- 12 feed industry, one representative from the fertilizer industry,
- 13 one representative of commercial agricultural lenders, one
- 14 representative of local government, one representative of
- 15 academia who shall be an agronomist or plant scientist faculty
- 16 member of the school of agriculture of a Pennsylvania college or
- 17 university, one representative of academia who shall be an
- 18 animal science faculty member with an expertise in odor
- 19 management from the school of agriculture of a college or
- 20 university within this Commonwealth, one hydrologist, two
- 21 citizen representatives who are not farmers and one
- 22 environmental representative, all of whom shall have sufficient
- 23 knowledge, experience or familiarity with agronomic practices,
- 24 nutrient management practices or odor management practices and
- 25 all of whom shall be residents of this Commonwealth.
- 26 (b) Compensation. -- Board members shall not receive a salary
- 27 but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary
- 28 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
- (c) Meetings. -- A majority of the board shall constitute a
- 30 quorum. All actions of the board shall be by a majority vote.

- 1 The board shall meet upon the call of the commission, but not
- 2 less than semiannually, to carry out its duties under this
- 3 chapter. The board shall annually select a chairman and such
- 4 other officers as it deems appropriate.
- 5 (d) Duties. -- The board shall review and comment on all
- 6 commission proposed regulations, the interim guidelines under
- 7 section 504(2) (relating to powers and duties of commission) and
- 8 the interim criteria under section 504(5) developed to implement
- 9 the provisions of this chapter. The commission shall have no
- 10 power to promulgate regulations, interim guidelines or interim
- 11 criteria under this chapter until receipt of written comments on
- 12 the proposed regulations, guidelines or criteria from the board
- 13 or until 60 days have expired from the date when the
- 14 regulations, guidelines or criteria were submitted by the
- 15 commission to the board for its comments. Existing regulations,
- 16 guidelines and criteria shall continue until modified,
- 17 superseded or repealed by the commission.
- (e) Term.--The term of office for each board member shall be
- 19 three years except that the commission shall stagger the initial
- 20 terms of the charter members such that five shall serve for one
- 21 year, five shall serve for two years and six shall serve for
- 22 three years. Board members may be appointed to successive terms
- 23 at the discretion of the commission, provided that no member may
- 24 serve more than two three-year terms.]

- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 <u>"Agricultural operation." An enterprise that is engaged in</u>
- 8 <u>agriculture as defined in section 701 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 9 "Animal operation." An agricultural operation in which
- 10 animals are raised or kept for commercial purposes.
- 11 "Board." The Farm Animal Advisory Board established under
- 12 <u>section 802</u> (relating to establishment of Farm Animal Advisory
- 13 Board).
- 14 "CAO operator." The owner or operator of a concentrated
- 15 <u>animal operation</u>.
- 16 "Commission." The State Conservation Commission established
- 17 by the act of May 15, 1945 (P.L.547, No.217), known as the
- 18 Conservation District Law.
- 19 "Commission chair." The chairperson of the State
- 20 Conservation Commission.
- 21 "Concentrated animal feeding operation" or "CAFO." As
- 22 <u>defined in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.2 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 23 "Concentrated animal operation" or "CAO." An animal
- 24 operation that meets the criteria established under 3 Pa.C.S.
- 25 Ch. 5 (relating to nutrient management and odor management).
- 26 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
- 27 <u>the Commonwealth.</u>
- 28 <u>"General CAFO permittee." An owner or operator of a CAFO</u>
- 29 which has received approval from the department to operate under
- 30 a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general

- 1 permit.
- 2 <u>"Individual CAFO permittee." An owner or operator of a CAFO</u>
- 3 that has been issued a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination
- 4 System individual permit by the department.
- 5 "Regulatory proposal." A proposed regulation or guideline,
- 6 proposed amendment to a regulation or guideline or proposed
- 7 <u>change in interpretation of administrative, regulatory or</u>
- 8 enforcement policy that intends to or will have the effect of
- 9 <u>increasing requirements imposed or imposing more stringent</u>
- 10 <u>standards on animal operations.</u>
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Environmental Protection of
- 12 <u>the Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 "Voting members." Board members listed in section 802(b)(1),
- 14 (2) and (3).
- 15 § 802. Establishment of Farm Animal Advisory Board.
- 16 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Farm Animal Advisory Board is</u>
- 17 established within the department.
- 18 (b) Members. -- The board shall be comprised of the following
- 19 <u>members:</u>
- 20 (1) Four individuals who own or operate an animal
- 21 operation, selected from nominations submitted by the
- 22 Pennsylvania Farm Bureau, Pennsylvania State Grange, PennAg
- 23 Industries Association and Pennsylvania Farmers Union. Each
- 24 organization under this paragraph shall submit a list of
- 25 <u>nominations to the secretary, who shall appoint one member</u>
- from each organization's list.
- 27 (2) Five general CAFO permittees or CAO operators from
- 28 mature dairy cow, veal calf, cattle other than mature dairy
- 29 <u>cows or veal calves, swine, horse, sheep or lamb, turkey,</u>
- 30 laying hen or broiler, chicken other than laying hens, and

1	duck operations. All individuals appointed under this
2	paragraph shall be from distinct operations.
3	(3) Two individual CAFO permittees from distinct
4	operations listed under paragraph (2).
5	(4) Four individuals, who shall serve as ex officio,
6	<pre>nonvoting members:</pre>
7	(i) Two members of the faculty of The Pennsylvania
8	State University, one with expertise in agronomy and
9	plant science and one with expertise in animal science
10	and odor management, appointed annually by The
11	Pennsylvania State University.
12	(ii) One deputy secretary from the Department of
13	Agriculture and one deputy secretary from the department.
14	If a named deputy secretary is unable to serve on the
15	board, the deputy secretary shall be replaced by another
16	deputy secretary or by the secretary of the department
17	represented.
18	(c) Appointment and term The secretary, in consultation
19	with the Secretary of Agriculture, shall appoint the members to
20	serve under subsections (b)(1), (2) and (3). The terms of each
21	member shall be three years, but the secretary shall stagger the
22	initial terms of charter members under this subsection such that
23	three shall serve for one year, three shall serve for two years
24	and five shall serve for three years. Board members may be
25	appointed to successive terms.
26	(d) Compensation Board members shall not receive a salary
27	but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary
28	expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
29	(e) MeetingsA majority of the board shall constitute a
30	quorum. All actions of the board shall be by a majority vote of

- 1 the voting members. The board shall meet upon call of the
- 2 secretary, but not less than semiannually, to carry out the
- 3 <u>board's duties under this chapter.</u>
- 4 (f) Chairperson. -- The board shall annually elect a board
- 5 <u>chairperson from among the voting members.</u>
- 6 (g) Staff.--The department shall furnish the board with
- 7 <u>administrative support, including the development of board</u>
- 8 bylaws consistent with this chapter and providing meeting space.
- 9 § 803. Powers of board.
- The board shall have the following powers:
- 11 (1) To provide advice and expertise to the secretary and
- 12 <u>the commission chair concerning animal operations.</u>
- 13 (2) To provide advice and expertise to the commission
- 14 <u>and the commission chair regarding nutrient management and</u>
- 15 alternative uses of animal manure.
- 16 (3) To assist the secretary and the commission chair in
- 17 the development of regulatory standards and provide written
- 18 comments on new and existing interpretive, administrative and
- 19 enforcement policies and regulatory proposals affecting
- animal operations in this Commonwealth, including
- 21 requirements, time lines and fee schedules for general and
- 22 individual National Pollution Discharge Elimination System
- permits.
- 24 (4) To assist the secretary and the commission by
- 25 providing comments on regulatory proposals under section 804
- (relating to review of regulations).
- 27 <u>§ 804. Review of regulations.</u>
- 28 (a) Notice to board. -- The department and commission shall
- 29 notify the board of the development of a regulatory proposal
- 30 that may affect animal operations as early as possible but not

- 1 <u>less than 150 days prior to the date the proposal is formally</u>
- 2 <u>initiated by an agency.</u>
- 3 (b) Meeting and consultation with board. -- At the request of
- 4 the board, if the request is made within 30 days from the date
- 5 of receipt of the notice required by subsection (a), the
- 6 proposing agency shall meet and consult with the board in the
- 7 <u>formulation of the regulatory proposal, and then the board may</u>
- 8 provide the proposing agency with written comments.
- 9 (c) Inclusion of comments with proposed rulemaking.--The
- 10 proposing agency shall include any written comments of the board
- 11 received prior to the initiation of proposed rulemaking or
- 12 <u>formal action taken on the regulatory proposal. For a regulatory</u>
- 13 proposal for which proposed rulemaking is not required, the
- 14 proposing agency shall prepare and submit to the board a
- 15 document that responds to comments offered by the board,
- 16 <u>including reasons why recommendations offered by the board in</u>
- 17 its comments were not adopted.
- 18 (d) Exceptions. -- The requirements of this section shall not
- 19 apply to regulations with mandatory statutory deadlines, court-
- 20 ordered regulations, emergency regulations, final regulations
- 21 adopted under section 204 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769,
- 22 No.240), referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, or
- 23 interim regulations otherwise authorized by statute. As soon as
- 24 possible, the department shall advise the board as to the
- 25 development of regulations under this subsection that would
- 26 regulate animal operations.
- 27 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
