AN ACT

- Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in public safety, providing for the
- 3 School Safety and Security Program.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 1 § 2101. Short title of chapter.
- 2 This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the School
- 3 Safety and Security Program Act.
- 4 <u>§ 2102. Purpose.</u>
- 5 The purpose of this chapter is to create a program that
- 6 provides an achievable and affordable safe learning and working
- 7 <u>environment in all schools of this Commonwealth by using</u>
- 8 <u>innovative tools</u>, <u>security industry best practices and</u>
- 9 technology to help school personnel prepare for, mitigate and
- 10 <u>respond to potential life-threatening situations.</u>
- 11 § 2103. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 15 <u>"Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and</u>
- 16 Delinguency.
- 17 <u>"Committee." The School Safety and Security Program</u>
- 18 Committee established under section 2104 (relating to School
- 19 Safety and Security Program Committee).
- 20 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 21 Commonwealth.
- "Learning Management System" or "LMS." A web-based software
- 23 system for assessments, surveys and training that, at a minimum,
- 24 has the following capabilities:
- 25 (1) Collects school safety data from electronic and in-
- 26 <u>person assessments.</u>
- 27 (2) Identifies school entities that are noncompliant
- 28 with best practices for school safety and security
- established by the committee.
- 30 (3) Contains assessment data, surveys, school safety and

- 1 security plans and training programs that are customizable to
- 2 <u>each school entity and building.</u>
- 3 <u>(4) Provides reports for users authorized by the</u>
- 4 <u>committee</u>.
- 5 (5) Offers an online classroom for web-based training.
- 6 (6) Provides for all data collected by the system to be
- 7 <u>owned and controlled by the Commonwealth.</u>
- 8 "Program." The School Safety and Security Program under
- 9 <u>section 2105(a)(1) (relating to powers and duties of committee).</u>
- 10 The critical elements of the program are assessing and planning
- 11 and training, equipping and sustaining school entities to meet
- 12 <u>best school safety and security practices.</u>
- 13 "Risk and vulnerability assessment." The process of defining
- 14 and analyzing the dangers to and susceptibilities of
- 15 <u>individuals</u>, school entities and school employees in the event
- 16 of natural and human-caused adverse events.
- 17 "School employee security capability assessment." The
- 18 process of identifying the current abilities of all school
- 19 employees to prepare for, mitigate and respond to potential
- 20 life-threatening situations.
- 21 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
- 22 vocational-technical school, charter school or a private
- 23 <u>residential rehabilitation institution as defined in section</u>
- 24 914.1-A(c) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 25 as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 26 "School safety and security plan." A written standardized
- 27 <u>document used by school entities and authorized personnel to</u>
- 28 prepare for, mitigate and respond to life-threatening
- 29 situations, including, but not limited to, threats of violence,
- 30 violent events, fires, severe weather, natural disasters,

- 1 medical emergencies and hazardous situations.
- 2 § 2104. School Safety and Security Program Committee.
- 3 (a) Committee established. -- The School Safety and Security
- 4 Program Committee is established within the Pennsylvania
- 5 <u>Commission on Crime and Delinquency.</u>
- 6 (b) Composition. -- The committee shall consist of the
- 7 <u>following:</u>
- 8 (1) Four members, one of whom shall be appointed by the
- 9 President pro tempore of the Senate, one of whom shall be
- 10 appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate, one of whom
- shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives and one of whom shall be appointed by the
- 13 <u>Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 14 (2) A chairperson who shall be appointed by the
- 15 Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two-thirds of
- 16 <u>all the members of the Senate.</u>
- 17 (3) The Secretary of Education or a designee who shall
- be an employee of the department.
- 19 (4) The Director of the Pennsylvania Emergency
- 20 <u>Management Agency or a designee who shall be an employee of</u>
- 21 the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
- 22 (5) The Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police or a
- designee who shall be an employee of the Pennsylvania State
- 24 <u>Police.</u>
- 25 (6) The Attorney General or a designee who shall be an
- 26 <u>employee of the Office of Attorney General.</u>
- 27 (7) A representative from the Pennsylvania Association
- 28 <u>of School Business Officials.</u>
- 29 <u>(8) A representative from the Pennsylvania Fraternal</u>
- 30 Order of Police.

1	(9) Six members who are recognized subject matter
2	experts, one member to represent each of the following areas,
3	selected by the legislative appointees to the committee under
4	subsection (b) (1):
5	(i) Mental health.
6	(ii) Strategic security.
7	(iii) Security equipment.
8	(iv) Architecture.
9	(v) Information technology systems.
0	(vi) County emergency management administration.
1	(c) Terms The terms of the members shall be as follows:
.2	(1) The members specified under subsection (b) (1) shall
_3	serve for a term of three years and shall not be eligible to
4	serve more than two full consecutive three-year terms. A
.5	member shall remain on the committee until the member's
6	replacement is appointed.
_7	(2) The terms of the members under subsection (b)(3),
8 ـ	(4), (5) and (6) shall be concurrent with their service in
_9	the office from which they derive their membership.
20	(3) The members under subsection (b)(2), (7), (8) and
21	(9) shall serve four-year terms and shall not be eligible to
22	serve more than two full consecutive four-year terms. A
23	member shall remain on the committee until the member's
24	replacement is appointed.
25	(d) Quorum A majority of the members of the committee
26	shall constitute a quorum. Action may be taken by the committee
27	at a meeting upon a vote of a quorum of its members present in
28	person or through electronic means.
29	(e) Meetings The committee shall meet as necessary at the
30	call of the chairperson.

- 1 (f) Reimbursement.--The committee members shall serve
- 2 without compensation but may be reimbursed for necessary and
- 3 reasonable expenses incurred in attending meetings of the
- 4 committee and in the performance of duties under section 2105
- 5 <u>(relating to powers and duties of committee).</u>
- 6 (g) Formation. -- The committee shall be formed within 15 days
- 7 of the effective date of this chapter.
- 8 (h) Interim chairperson. -- Until such time as the chairperson
- 9 <u>is confirmed by the Senate, the committee shall select an</u>
- 10 <u>interim chair from among its membership.</u>
- 11 (i) Staffing. -- The commission shall cooperate with the
- 12 committee to select staff to be employed by the commission and
- 13 <u>assigned to support the committee to adequately perform the</u>
- 14 <u>duties outlined in section 2105.</u>
- 15 § 2105. Powers and duties of committee.
- 16 (a) Duties. -- The committee has the power and duty to:
- 17 (1) Oversee, direct and evaluate the implementation of
- the School Safety and Security Program.
- 19 (2) Establish best practices related to assessment,
- training standards, planning and compliance oversight in all
- 21 <u>matters regarding school safety and security.</u>
- 22 (3) Identify or develop, update and maintain a database
- for all program-gathered information for use by school
- employees and other authorized personnel. The Commonwealth
- 25 <u>shall maintain control of any data collected under the</u>
- 26 program.
- 27 (4) Identify or develop, update and maintain a Learning
- 28 Management System for use by school employees and other
- 29 <u>authorized personnel, which shall include updating and</u>
- 30 maintaining a risk and vulnerability assessment and school

- 1 employee security capability assessment tool.
- 2 (5) Develop a school safety and security assessment
- 3 process.
- 4 (6) Establish a minimum set of qualifications and
- 5 certifications for school employees and third-party vendors
- 6 to assist in the risk and vulnerability and school employee
- 7 <u>security capability assessment process.</u>
- 8 (7) Advise and assist the department in the
- 9 <u>dissemination, completion and analysis of the LMS assessment</u>
- 10 data by all school entities.
- 11 (8) Identify or develop, update and maintain a
- 12 <u>standardized school safety and security plan for use by all</u>
- 13 <u>school entities.</u>
- 14 (9) Establish a minimum set of qualifications and
- certifications for school employees and third-party vendors
- to assist in the development of a standardized school safety
- 17 and security plan.
- 18 <u>(10) Oversee the dissemination and modification of the</u>
- 19 standardized school safety and security plan.
- 20 (11) Identify or develop, update and maintain a
- 21 <u>standardized school safety and security training program,</u>
- 22 including web-based and live, scenario-based training.
- 23 (12) Establish a minimum set of qualifications and
- 24 certifications for school employees and third-party vendors
- 25 to assist in the development of web-based and live scenario-
- 26 based training related to the school safety and security
- 27 <u>plan. Employees required to undergo continuing education</u>
- 28 under section 1205.2 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, shall
- 30 receive credit toward their continuing professional education

1	<u>requirements if the training program has been approved by the</u>
2	department in consultation with the commission.
3	(13) Oversee the development, updating and modification
4	of all school safety and security training related to the
5	standardized school safety and security plan for use by
6	school employees and qualified, certified third-party vendors
7	in the delivery of web-based and live scenario-based
8	training.
9	(14) Establish a minimum set of qualifications and
10	certifications for school employees and third-party vendors
11	in the delivery of web-based and live scenario-based
12	training.
13	(15) Develop, update and maintain an annual sustainment
14	program related to the assessment, planning, training and
15	implementation processes outlined under this subsection.
16	(b) Coordination The committee shall coordinate with the
17	commission and the department to carry out the duties under
18	subsection (a). The following apply:
19	(1) Beginning November 1, 2018, at least 600
20	standardized onsite school safety and security assessments
21	shall be completed annually. School entities shall be
22	identified and prioritized based upon initial assessment data
23	results.
24	(2) Beginning September 1, 2019, at least 750
25	standardized live, scenario-based training sessions shall be
26	<pre>conducted annually.</pre>
27	(3) Prior to the start of the 2019-2020 school year, all
28	school entities shall have completed or received:
29	(i) An initial school employee security capability
30	assessment.

- 1 (ii) An initial school safety and security plan.
- 2 (iii) An initial LMS school safety and security
- 3 training course.
- 4 § 2106. Duties of department.
- 5 <u>(a) Duties.--The department shall:</u>
- 6 (1) Deliver the LMS to school employees and other
- 7 <u>authorized personnel by October 1, 2018. The LMS data shall</u>
- be gathered by October 31, 2018.
- 9 <u>(2) After the initial gathering of LMS data under</u>
- 10 paragraph (1), utilize the LMS to gather data on or before
- 11 <u>September 1 of each year.</u>
- 12 (3) Provide the annual LMS data to the committee.
- 13 <u>(b) Coordination.--The department shall:</u>
- 14 (1) Coordinate with the commission and committee to
- 15 <u>carry out the duties under subsection (a).</u>
- 16 (2) Coordinate with the commission on training,
- 17 including, but not limited to, training under section
- 18 <u>2105(11), (12), (13) and (14) (relating to powers and duties</u>
- of committee).
- 20 (c) Noncompliance. -- The department may withhold any funding
- 21 related to school safety and security to any school district
- 22 that fails to comply with the program.
- 23 § 2107. Confidentiality.
- 24 (a) Right-to-Know Law inapplicable. -- Data provided for the
- 25 purposes of carrying out the requirements of this chapter shall
- 26 be confidential and shall not be subject to the act of February
- 27 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, or
- 28 <u>discoverable or admissible as evidence in any civil, criminal or</u>
- 29 administrative action or proceeding.
- 30 (b) Access to data. -- Nothing in this section shall prohibit

- 1 the committee from accessing the data to carry out
- 2 <u>responsibilities in accordance with this chapter.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
