1 2 3 4	Amending Title 26 (Eminent Domain) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitations on use of eminent domain, further providing for definitions and providing for eminent domain of land subject to conservation easement.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Section 202 of Title 26 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read:
9	§ 202. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
11	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	* * *
14	"Conservation easement." As defined under section 3 of the
15	act of June 22, 2001 (P.L.390, No.29), known as the Conservation
16	and Preservation Easements Act.
17	* * *
18	"Open space benefits." The benefits to the residents of the
19	Commonwealth and its local government units which result from

1	the preservation or restriction of the use of selected
2	predominantly undeveloped open spaces or areas, including, but
3	not limited to:
4	(1) the protection and conservation of water resources
5	and watersheds, by appropriate means, including, but not
6	limited to, preserving the natural cover, preventing floods
7	and soil erosion, protecting water quality and replenishing
8	surface and ground water supplies;
9	(2) the protection and conservation of forests and land
10	being used to produce timber crops;
11	(3) the protection and conservation of farmland;
12	(4) the protection of existing or planned park,
13	recreation or conservation sites;
14	(5) the protection and conservation of natural or scenic
15	resources, including, but not limited to, soils, beaches,
16	streams, flood plains, steep slopes or marshes;
17	(6) the protection of scenic areas for public visual
18	enjoyment from public rights of way;
19	(7) the preservation of sites of historic, geologic or
20	botanic interest; and
21	(8) the promotion of sound, cohesive and efficient land
22	development by preserving open spaces between communities.

24	Section 2. Title 26 is amended by adding a section to read:
25	§ 208. Eminent domain of land subject to conservation easement.
26	(a) Approval requiredNo agency of the Commonwealth,
27	political subdivision, authority, public utility or other body
28	having or exercising powers of eminent domain shall condemn any
29	land subject to a conservation easement for any purpose, unless
30	prior approval has been obtained from the orphans' court of the
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1	county in which the land is located. The condemnation approval
2	specified by this subsection shall not be required for an
3	underground public utility facility that does not permanently
4	impact the open space benefits protected by the conservation
5	easement.
6	(b) Determination of blightThe exercise of eminent domain
7	powers based on a condition of the land subject to a
8	conservation easement shall not be authorized under section 205
9	(relating to blight) unless the orphans' court determines the
10	exercise is necessary to protect the health and safety of the
11	community.
12	(c) NoticeAny condemnor wishing to condemn property, the
13	approval for which is required under this section, shall, at
14	least 30 days prior to taking such action, notify the orphans'
15	court that the action is contemplated.
16	(d) ReviewThe orphans' court shall review the proposed
17	condemnation and approve the proposed condemnation only if the
18	court determines there is no reasonable and prudent alternative
19	to the utilization of the land subject to a conservation
20	easement for the project.
21	(e) Findings and decisionsThe orphans' court shall render
22	findings and decisions of the court's review under subsection
23	(d) and shall report the findings and decisions to the proposed
24	<u>condemnor.</u>
25	(f) InjunctionsThe orphans' court may request the
26	Attorney General to bring an action to enjoin a condemnor from
27	violating any provision of this section.
28	(g) Emergencies exceptionThis section shall not apply to
29	any emergency project which is immediately necessary for the
30	protection of life or property.

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Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable. If any
provision of this act or its application to any person or
circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect
other provisions or applications of this act which can be given
effect without the invalid provision or application.
Section 4. The following provisions shall apply to a

7 condemnation for which a declaration of taking is filed after 8 December 31, 2017:

9 (1) The addition of the definitions of "conservation 10 easement" and "open space benefits" in 26 Pa.C.S. § 202.

11 (2) The addition of 26 Pa.C.S. § 208.

12 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
