AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council; and 2 providing for its powers and duties.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 7 Career Readiness Council Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Charter School." A charter school, regional charter school
- 13 or cyber charter school established under Article XVII-A of the
- 14 Public School Code of 1949.
- 15 "Chief school administrator." The superintendent or chief
- 16 executive officer of a school district, director of an area
- 17 vocational-technical school, executive director of an

- 1 intermediate unit or chief executive officer of a charter
- 2 school, regional charter school or cyber charter school.
- 3 "Community college." An institution created under either of
- 4 the following:
- 5 (1) Article XIX-A of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 6 (2) The act of August 24, 1963 (P.L.1132, No.484), known
- 7 as the Community College Act of 1963.
- 8 "Council." The Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council
- 9 established under this act.
- 10 "High-priority occupation." A job category, within selected
- 11 industry clusters, that is identified by the Department of Labor
- 12 and Industry as:
- 13 (1) being in demand by employers;
- 14 (2) having higher skill needs; and
- 15 (3) likely to provide family-sustaining wages.
- "Independent institution of higher education." The term as
- 17 defined under section 2001-C of the Public School Code of 1949.
- "Intermediate Unit." A geographic unit as described under
- 19 Article IX-A of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 20 "Labor organization." As follows:
- 21 (1) The term as defined under section 3(f) of the act of
- 22 June 1, 1937 (P.L.1168, No.294), known as the Pennsylvania
- 23 Labor Relations Act.
- 24 (2) An "employe organization," as defined under section
- 25 301(3) of the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known
- as the Public Employe Relations Act.
- 27 "Local workforce investment board." The term as defined
- 28 under section 103 of the Workforce Development Act.
- 29 "Pennsylvania Workforce Investment Board." The Pennsylvania
- 30 Workforce Investment Board established under section 301 of the

- 1 Workforce Development Act.
- 2 "Public School Code of 1949." The act of March 10, 1949
- 3 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 4 "Rural public school district." A public school district
- 5 that has a population of less than 300 people per square mile.
- 6 The term also includes an intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 7 technical school if the composite data for all participating
- 8 school districts meet the criteria specified under this
- 9 definition.
- 10 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
- 11 vocational-technical school or charter school.
- "State-related institution." The Pennsylvania State
- 13 University, the University of Pittsburgh, Temple University,
- 14 Lincoln University and their branch campuses.
- "State System of Higher Education." The State System of
- 16 Higher Education established under Article XX-A of the Public
- 17 School Code of 1949.
- "Suburban public school district." A public school district
- 19 that has a population of at least 300 people per square mile and
- 20 not more than 850 people per square mile. The term also includes
- 21 an intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school if the
- 22 composite data for all participating school districts meet the
- 23 criteria specified under this definition.
- "Urban public school district." A public school district
- 25 that has a population of more than 850 people per square mile.
- 26 The term also includes an intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 27 technical school if the composite data for all participating
- 28 school districts meet the criteria specified under this
- 29 definition.
- "Workforce Development Act." The act of December 18, 2001

- 1 (P.L.949, No.114), known as the Workforce Development Act.
- 2 Section 3. Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council.
- 3 (a) Establishment. -- The Pennsylvania Career Readiness
- 4 Council is established.
- 5 (b) Membership. -- The Pennsylvania Career Readiness Council
- 6 shall consist of the following members:
- 7 (1) One representative of directors of a local workforce
- 8 development board appointed by the Governor from a list of
- 9 three qualified director representatives recommended by the
- 10 Pennsylvania Workforce Development Board.
- 11 (2) One member of the Pennsylvania Workforce Development
- Board appointed by the Secretary of Labor and Industry.
- 13 (3) One representative of presidents of institutions of
- the State System of Higher Education appointed by the
- Governor from a list of three qualified president
- representatives recommended by the Chancellor of the State
- 17 System of Higher Education.
- 18 (4) One representative of presidents of community
- 19 colleges appointed by the Governor from a list of three
- 20 qualified president representatives recommended by the
- 21 Pennsylvania Commission for Community Colleges.
- 22 (5) One representative of chief school administrators
- appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified
- 24 chief school administrators recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 25 Association of Intermediate Units.
- 26 (6) One member of the State Board of Education appointed
- 27 by the Secretary of Education.
- 28 (7) One representative of chief school administrators
- 29 appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified
- 30 chief school administrators recommended by the Pennsylvania

- 1 Association of Career and Technical Administrators.
 - (8) One representative of directors of economic development entities appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified director representatives recommended by the Pennsylvania Economic Development Association.
 - (9) One representative of presidents of local chambers of business and industry appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified presidents recommended by the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry.
 - (10) Six chief executive officers in high-growth industries that collectively represent the business diversity of this Commonwealth, accounting for size, geography and industry appointed by the following:
 - (i) Two members appointed by the Governor, one of whom shall be from a list of three qualified chief executive officers recommended in a letter of interest by the staff of the council.
 - (ii) One member appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate.
 - (iii) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate.
 - (iv) One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 24 (v) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of 25 the House of Representatives.
- 26 (11) The Governor, the Secretary of Community and
 27 Economic Development, the Secretary of Education, the
 28 Secretary of Labor and Industry, the President pro tempore of
 29 the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of
 30 the House of Representatives and the Minority Leader of the

- 1 House of Representatives, who shall be ex officio members.
- 2 (c) Designees.--Governmental members may appoint a designee
- 3 to attend and vote at meetings of the council. Each governmental
- 4 member who appoints a designee shall do so by sending a letter
- 5 to the chairperson stating the name of the designee.
- 6 (d) Terms. -- The following shall apply:
- 7 (1) The initial terms of members appointed under
- 8 subsection (b) shall be staggered as follows:
- 9 (i) Five members shall serve a term of one year.
- 10 (ii) Five members shall serve a term of two years.
- 11 (iii) Five members shall serve a term of three
- 12 years.
- 13 (2) The subsequent terms of members appointed under
- subsection (b) shall be three years.
- 15 (e) Vacancies. -- If a vacancy on the council occurs, the
- 16 appointing authority shall appoint an individual to fill the
- 17 vacancy in accordance with the criteria under subsection (b).
- 18 (f) Executive director. -- The following shall apply:
- 19 (1) The Governor shall nominate an individual as
- 20 executive director to the council. The council shall ratify
- 21 the nomination for executive director with a vote of a simple
- 22 majority of the members of the council.
- 23 (2) The executive director may hire additional staff as
- 24 necessary and as funding allows.
- 25 (g) Council leadership. -- The following shall apply:
- 26 (1) The Governor shall serve as the chairperson of the
- council.
- 28 (2) The Governor shall select an appointed business
- 29 chief executive to serve as vice-chairperson of the council
- in accordance with subsection (b).

- 1 (h) Meetings.--The following shall apply:
- 2 (1) The council shall meet at the call of the
- 3 chairperson, but no less than four times a year.
- 4 (2) The chairperson, in consultation with the vice-
- 5 chairperson, shall establish the agenda for each meeting of
- 6 the council.
- 7 (i) Quorum and official action. -- The following shall apply:
- 8 (1) A majority of voting members of the council shall
- 9 constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting business.
- 10 (2) The affirmative votes of a majority of voting
- 11 members of the council are necessary for the council to take
- 12 official action.
- 13 (j) Reimbursement. -- The members of the council may not
- 14 receive a salary or per diem allowance for serving as members of
- 15 the council, but shall be reimbursed for the actual and
- 16 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of the members'
- 17 duties.
- 18 (k) Funding. -- The council may accept appropriations from the
- 19 General Assembly, grants from the Federal Government, grants
- 20 from the Commonwealth, money from private entities or any
- 21 combination thereof.
- 22 (1) Conflict of interest. -- A member of the council may not
- 23 vote on a matter under consideration by the council:
- 24 (1) regarding the provision of services by the member or
- by an entity that the member represents; or
- 26 (2) which would provide direct financial benefit to the
- 27 member or the immediate family of the member.
- 28 Section 4. Duties of the council.
- 29 (a) Duties. -- The council shall:
- 30 (1) Within 180 days of the effective date of this

- section, develop a vision and mission statement that makes clear the council's purpose as well as the respective roles and responsibilities of council members.
 - (2) Within one year of the effective date of this section, develop a plan in consultation with the Pennsylvania Workforce Investment Board to improve this Commonwealth's career readiness preparation system. The plan developed under this paragraph shall include, but not be limited to:

(i) Proposed changes to:

- (A) improve the transition from K-12 education and postsecondary education to the work force; and
- (B) ensure that programs are aligned with current or anticipated business and industry needs.
- (ii) Proposed changes, including recommended legislation and rules, to increase coordination, data sharing and communication among State, local and private agencies, groups and associations that are involved in education, job skills development and career training.
- (iii) Proposed changes to make this Commonwealth a leader in employment opportunities related to the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.
- (3) Identify appropriate information and request appropriate data disaggregated by subgroups from council members in order to make recommendations for system improvement and set goals regarding, at minimum, the following areas:
- (i) Availability of and access to high-quality career pathways in high-skill, high-demand industry occupations spanning secondary and postsecondary education.

- - (iii) Availability of and access to postsecondary credit and industry-recognized credentials in high-skill, high-demand occupations, especially those related to the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.
 - (4) Develop a sustainable process for identifying and addressing equity gaps in the career preparation delivery system.
 - (5) Develop a sustainable process for identifying opportunities to align this Commonwealth's education and training pipeline in response to labor market needs, including, but not limited to:
 - (i) Cataloging all funding sources, including
 Federal, State and private, that can be utilized for
 education, career training and work force preparation.
 - (ii) Reviewing funding streams for overlaps and gaps with a special focus on identifying areas with inequitable student access.
 - (iii) Developing and implementing plans to improve alignment and more effectively prepare all secondary students for postsecondary success in high-skill, high-demand occupations.
 - (iv) Identifying strategies for leveraging and aligning Federal, State and private funding sources.
 - (6) Create a public repository that includes, but is not limited to, national and state model partnerships between industry and education, career pathway programs in this

1 Commonwealth and other national and state best practices in 2 career readiness preparation. 3 (7) Coordinate Statewide and regional conventions to: highlight national and state best practices; 4 (ii) connect the work within this Commonwealth; and 5 (iii) benchmark the work toward national standards. 6 7 (8) Develop and maintain a marketing, communications and 8 stakeholder engagement strategy, with a website and other 9 public materials, to be maintained by the executive director 10 and council staff. (9) Obtain input from the following: 11 12 (i)Employers and employer organizations located in this Commonwealth. 13 14 State System of Higher Education institutions, 15 State-related institutions, community colleges and independent institutions of higher education. 16 17 (iii) Regional and local economic development 18 organizations. 19 (iv) Labor organizations located in this 20 Commonwealth. 21 Individuals with expertise in career readiness 22 preparation activities. 23 (vi) Local workforce investment boards. 24 (vii) School entities. 25 (viii) Military and veterans organizations. 26 (ix) Organizations representing women, African 27 Americans, Latinos and other significant minority populations, and having an interest in issues of 28 29 particular concern to these populations. 30 Any other individual or organization that a

- 1 majority of the voting members of the council determines
- 2 has information that is important for the council to
- 3 consider.
- 4 (b) Report. -- The council shall submit an annual report to
- 5 the General Assembly, the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief
- 6 Clerk of the House of Representatives that details the progress
- 7 made by the council according to the plan referenced under
- 8 subsection (a)(2), with accompanying recommendations for further
- 9 action to be taken.
- 10 Section 5. Effective date.
- 11 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
