A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of February 2017 as "Turner Syndrome Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Turner syndrome is a noninheritable chromosomal
- 4 disorder that affects 1 in 2,500 live female births worldwide;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, A complete cardiac screening is an important
- 7 diagnostic tool to ensure early diagnosis in girls and women;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Risk for acute aortic dissection is increased by
- 10 more than a hundredfold in young and middle-aged women with
- 11 Turner syndrome; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Early diagnosis facilitates prevention or
- 13 remediation of growth failure, hearing problems and learning
- 14 difficulties; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Individuals with Turner syndrome have an increased
- 16 risk of a nonverbal learning disorder that can cause problems in
- 17 mathematics, visual-spatial skills, executive-function skills

- 1 and job retention; and
- 2 WHEREAS, A disproportionately small amount of funding is
- 3 available for Turner syndrome research and support; and
- 4 WHEREAS, With the help of medical specialists and a good
- 5 social support system, females with Turner syndrome can live a
- 6 happy and healthy life; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The establishment of "Turner Syndrome Awareness
- 8 Month" provides the opportunity to share experience and
- 9 information and raise public awareness about Turner syndrome;

- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of February
- 12 2017 as "Turner Syndrome Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
