A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the month of May 2017 as "Building Safety Month" in 1 Pennsylvania and encouraging residents to participate in 2 "Building Safety Month" activities. 3 4 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is committed to recognizing that our growth and strength depends on the safety and economic value of 5 6 the homes, buildings and infrastructure that serve our residents 7 in everyday life and in times of natural disaster; and 8 WHEREAS, Confidence in the structural integrity of buildings 9 that make up our communities is achieved through the devotion of 10 vigilant guardians, building safety and fire prevention officials, architects, engineers, builders, tradespeople, design 11 12 professionals, laborers and others in the construction industry 13 who work year-round to ensure the safe construction of 14 buildings; and 15 WHEREAS, These guardians are dedicated members of the 16 International Code Council (ICC), a United States based

voluntary consensus codes and standards developing organization

that brings together Federal, State and local officials who are

- 1 experts in the built environment to create and implement the
- 2 highest-quality codes to protect us in the buildings where we
- 3 live, learn, work, worship and play; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The dedicated members of the Pennsylvania
- 5 Association of Building Code Officials, Pennsylvania State
- 6 Professional Chapter of the International Code Council and the
- 7 members of other International Code Council chapters in
- 8 Pennsylvania, including the Lancaster County Code Association,
- 9 the Berks County Building and Code Association, the Pennsylvania
- 10 Building Officials Conference, the Commonwealth Building
- 11 Officials, the Pennsylvania Association of Code Officials, the
- 12 Liberty Chapter of Philadelphia, the Pennsylvania Association of
- 13 Fire Code Officials, the Professional Chapter of Western
- 14 Pennsylvania and PennBOC Regions 1 and 5, develop and implement
- 15 the highest-quality codes to inspect buildings; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Our nation benefits economically and technologically
- 17 from using the international codes that are developed by the
- 18 ICC; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Government is able to avoid the high cost and
- 20 complexity of developing and maintaining these codes, which are
- 21 the the most widely adopted building safety and fire prevention
- 22 codes in the nation; and
- 23 WHEREAS, These modern building codes include safeguards to
- 24 protect the public from natural disasters such as hurricanes,
- 25 snowstorms, tornadoes, wild land fires, floods and earthquake;
- 26 and
- 27 WHEREAS, "Building Safety Month" is sponsored by the
- 28 International Code Council and the Pennsylvania Association of
- 29 Building Code Officials, along with all of the other ICC
- 30 chapters in Pennsylvania, to remind the public about the

- 1 critical role of our communities' largely unknown guardians of
- 2 public safety, our local code officials, who assure us of safe,
- 3 efficient and livable buildings that are essential to keep
- 4 America great; and
- 5 WHEREAS, "Code Officials-Partners in Community Safety and
- 6 Economic Growth," the theme for "Building Safety Month,"
- 7 encourages all Americans to raise awareness of the importance of
- 8 building safety and resilient construction, fire prevention,
- 9 disaster mitigation and new technologies in the construction
- 10 industry; and
- 11 WHEREAS, "Building Safety Month" encourages appropriate steps
- 12 that everyone can take to ensure that the places where we live,
- 13 learn, work, worship and play are safe; and
- 14 WHEREAS, "Building Safety Month" recognizes that countless
- 15 lives have been saved due to the implementation of safety codes
- 16 by State and local agencies; and
- 17 WHEREAS, In observance of "Building Safety Month," Americans
- 18 are asked to consider the commitment to improve building safety
- 19 and economic investment at home and in the community and to
- 20 acknowledge the essential service provided to all of us by
- 21 Federal agencies, State and local building departments and fire
- 22 prevention bureaus in protecting lives and property; therefore
