A RESOLUTION

- Designating July 31, 2017, as "Heatstroke Prevention Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Heatstroke is the leading cause of noncrash vehicle-
- 4 related fatalities for children who are 14 years of age or
- 5 younger; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Unfortunately, even a great parent can forget and
- 7 leave a child in the back seat of a vehicle; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Risk factors that may lead to heatstroke in children
- 9 left in a vehicle include a caregiver who is not accustomed to
- 10 driving with a child in the vehicle and a caregiver whose
- 11 routine suddenly changes; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Heatstroke deaths have been recorded in 11 months of
- 13 the year in nearly all 50 states, including Pennsylvania; and
- 14 WHEREAS, July 31 is recognized as "National Heatstroke
- 15 Prevention Day"; and
- 16 WHEREAS, We can all help to reduce the number of injuries and
- 17 deaths caused by heatstroke by raising public awareness of the

- 4 "Heatstroke Prevention Day" in Pennsylvania.
