## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 14 through 20, 2018, as "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" brings
- attention to the growing problems and issues facing homeless
- children throughout this Commonwealth and across the nation; and 5
- 6 WHEREAS, Families with children are the fastest-growing
- 7 segment of the homeless population; and
- 8 WHEREAS, A total of 42% of homeless children in this
- 9 Commonwealth are six years of age or younger; and
- 10 WHEREAS, According to the Department of Education, there were
- more than 30,264 reported cases of homeless school-age children 11
- 12 in this Commonwealth during the 2016-2017 school year; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There are homeless students in every county in this
- 14 Commonwealth and these students are about 1% of the total
- 15 population enrolled in public schools; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, enacted
- 17 in 1987, states that children are homeless if they lack a fixed,

- 1 regular and adequate nighttime residence; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The Federal act provides the basis for agency
- 3 funding to combat homelessness and was later amended to include
- 4 protection for homeless youths in public education, effectively
- 5 defining how schools must handle this issue and what actions
- 6 must be taken; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Children of all ages are negatively impacted by
- 8 homelessness in the areas of physical health, emotional and
- 9 behavioral development, and academic success; and
- 10 WHEREAS, For many homeless students, coming to school every
- 11 day is the only stability they know, since they often face
- 12 obstacles like losing treasured possessions and dealing with
- 13 hunger and sleep deprivation; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Keeping a student in their original school is
- 15 essential to their education since every time a student changes
- 16 schools, they are set back academically by three to six months;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, The national school drop-out rate for homeless
- 19 children is 60% higher than for children who do not experience
- 20 homelessness during the school year; and
- 21 WHEREAS, For more than 19 years, the Homeless Children's
- 22 Education Fund has advanced the education of children and youths
- 23 experiencing homelessness in Allegheny County in an effort to
- 24 combat the statistics; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Many events are taking place in Pittsburgh during
- 26 "Homeless Children's Awareness Week," including three "Stand Up
- 27 for Homeless Children" performance art installations, an evening
- 28 of trivia and a karaoke night; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Individuals and groups across this Commonwealth are
- 30 encouraged to create their own events during "Homeless

- 1 Children's Awareness Week" to raise awareness about the needs
- 2 and challenges of children and youths experiencing homelessness;
- 3 therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of October 14
- 5 through 20, 2018, as "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in
- 6 Pennsylvania.
