A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to establish an 1 advisory committee to conduct a thorough and comprehensive 2 analysis of the potential impact of removing Cambria County 3 from the emissions testing program and report findings and 4 recommendations to the Senate. 5 6 WHEREAS, The Clean Air Act of 1963 was the first Federal 7 legislation regarding air pollution control, authorizing research into techniques for monitoring and controlling air 8 9 pollution; and 10 WHEREAS, The Clean Air Act of 1970 authorized the development 11 of comprehensive Federal and state regulations to limit 12 emissions from both stationary and mobile sources, including the 13 establishment of National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) 14 and requirements for State Implementation Plans (SIPs) to 15 achieve the NAAOS; and 16 WHEREAS, The Clean Air Act of 1970 also increased enforcement 17 authority and authorized requirements for control of motor 18 vehicle emissions; and 19 WHEREAS, The Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 substantially increased the authority and responsibility of the Federal 20

Government by authorizing new regulatory programs, increasing enforcement authority and expanding research programs; and WHEREAS, To ensure compliance with Federal standards, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) required states to submit for approval an SIP that included regulations the Commonwealth would use to clean up polluted areas; and

7 WHEREAS, The SIP that Pennsylvania submitted to the EPA 8 targeted vehicle emissions standards for 25 of Pennsylvania's 67 9 counties, including the most heavily polluted areas, mostly 10 urbanized areas and areas with heavy amounts of industrial 11 activity; and

12 WHEREAS, In 1997, the Commonwealth implemented the first 13 phase of the enhanced auto emissions testing program in nine 14 counties in the Philadelphia and Pittsburgh regions, with plans 15 to expand the emissions testing program to the remaining 16 16 counties over time; and

WHEREAS, In 1999, the planned expansion of the emissions testing program to the Lehigh Valley and South Central regions was delayed due to, in part, a lack of opportunity for stakeholder groups to guide the improvement plan for those regions; and

22 WHEREAS, The expansion of the emissions testing program to 23 the Lehigh Valley and South Central regions was again delayed to 24 allow the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and the 25 Department of Environmental Protection time to evaluate the 26 impact of new technology on the emissions inspection program; 27 and

28 WHEREAS, In 2002 and 2003, lawsuits were initiated by two 29 environmental groups challenging the limited implementation of 30 the SIP, ultimately leading to the Commonwealth's full

implementation of the vehicle emissions testing program by 1 2 bringing the remaining 16 counties identified in the SIP into 3 compliance with the vehicle emissions testing program, and resulting in the inclusion of most of the counties which require 4 this testing today, specifically regions designated as 5 nonattainment areas for ozone levels by the EPA; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The nonattainment classification requires areas 8 failing to meet the NAAQS for ground-level ozone to adhere to the SIP and to attain and maintain the standard; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Cambria County was designated as a marginal nonattainment area after November 1991; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Cambria County was redesignated as a maintenance 13 area based on the 1997 ozone standards, meaning Cambria County was successfully working toward attainment; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Cambria County was redesignated as an attainment 16 area based on 2008 ozone standards and is no longer listed as a 17 nonattainment or maintenance area; and 18 WHEREAS, In order to change which counties are required to participate in the emissions testing program, the Department of 19 20 Environmental Protection is required to submit a revised SIP to the EPA for approval; and 21 22 WHEREAS, The EPA approved Pennsylvania's fully implemented 23 SIP in 2005; therefore be it 24 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission 25 establish an advisory committee, consisting of representatives 26 of the Department of Transportation and the Department of Environmental Protection and others who possess knowledge of the 27 28 vehicle emission inspection program and the SIP to facilitate 29 the work of the Joint State Government Commission; and be it 30 further

1 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, working 2 with the advisory committee, conduct a thorough and 3 comprehensive analysis of issues relating to the potential 4 impact to the Commonwealth of removing Cambria County from the 5 emissions testing program; and be it further

6 RESOLVED, That the final report include recommendations to 7 make up for the loss of environmental credits associated with 8 the approved SIP, the cost in actual dollars, historically and 9 projected, to each of the respective departments, and any other 10 potential financial aspect to the Commonwealth; and be it

11 further

12 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission report 13 findings and recommendations to the Senate no later than one 14 year from the adoption of this resolution.
