14	Section 1. Section 13.7(c) of the act of April 14, 1972
15	(P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,
16	Device and Cosmetic Act, is amended to read:
17	Section 13.7. Drug Overdose Response Immunity* * *
18	(c) [Persons experiencing drug overdose events may not be
19	charged and shall be immune from prosecution as provided in
20	subsection (b) if a person who transported or reported and
21	remained with them may not be charged and is entitled to
22	immunity under this section.] (1) A person experiencing a drug

1	overdose event may not be charged and shall be immune from
2	prosecution if, within ten days after receiving medical
3	attention for the drug overdose event, the person experiencing
4	the drug overdose event obtained a screening and received a
5	referral for treatment from a properly accredited addiction
6	services provider, including a certified recovery specialist or
7	other trained medical professional.
8	(2) A person who transported or reported and remained with a
9	person experiencing a drug overdose event may not be charged and
10	is entitled to immunity under this section.

12	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
