## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An

act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, 5 further providing for Commission for Agricultural Education Excellence; in vocational education, providing for utilization of credits; and providing for classification of 8 program code. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 1549.1(1) of the act of March 10, 1949 13 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 14 15 Section 1549.1. Commission for Agricultural Education Excellence. -- \* \* \* 16 17 (1)The commission shall have all the following powers and 18 duties: \* \* \* 19 20

- 1 Education guidelines every five years to identify the
- 2 circumstances when a student who successfully completes an
- 3 academic course, program or activity for credit may apply the
- 4 <u>credit toward completion of an agriculture education program.</u>

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- 5 (6) IN CONSULTATION WITH AND WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
- 6 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, DEVELOP GUIDELINES TO IDENTIFY THE
- 7 CIRCUMSTANCES WHEN A STUDENT WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES AN
- 8 ACADEMIC COURSE, PROGRAM OR ACTIVITY FOR CREDIT MAY APPLY THE
- 9 CREDIT TOWARD THE COMPLETION OF AN AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION
- 10 PROGRAM. THE GUIDELINES DEVELOPED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL BE
- 11 POSTED ON THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE
- 12 <u>INTERNET WEBSITE WITHIN FIFTEEN DAYS OF APPROVAL. THE DEPARTMENT</u>
- 13 OF EDUCATION SHALL REVIEW THE GUIDELINES AT LEAST EVERY FIVE
- 14 YEARS. ANY PROPOSED UPDATE TO THE GUIDELINES SHALL BE DEVELOPED
- 15 IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSION.

- 17 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 18 <u>Section 1856. Utilization of Credits.--The Department of</u>
- 19 Education shall issue quidelines and update the quidelines every
- 20 <u>five years to identify the circumstances when a student who</u>
- 21 successfully completes a course, program or activity in science,
- 22 <u>technology</u>, engineering or mathematics for credit may apply the
- 23 credit toward the completion of a course, program or activity
- 24 offered by any area vocational-technical school, technical
- 25 <u>institute or vocational school or department.</u>
- 26 Section 3. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 27 <u>ARTICLE XIX-H</u>
- 28 <u>CLASSIFICATION OF PROGRAM CODE</u>
- 29 <u>Section 1901-H. Definitions.</u>
- The following words and phrases when used in this article

- 1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 3 "Classification of program code." A numerical coding of
- 4 <u>instructional programs developed by the United States Department</u>
- 5 of Education used to identify vocational programs.
- 6 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 7 Commonwealth.
- 8 "Public school entity." A school district, charter school,
- 9 regional charter school, cyber charter school, intermediate unit
- 10 or area vocational-technical school.
- 11 Section 1902-H. Establishment or renewal of classification of
- 12 program code.
- 13 The department shall establish a standard application form
- 14 for a public school entity seeking approval to establish or
- 15 renew a classification of program code. The form shall be
- 16 published on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 17 website. The form shall require the following information:
- 18 (1) The name of the public school entity seeking
- 19 <u>approval to establish or renew a classification of program</u>
- 20 <u>code</u>.
- 21 (2) The title of the classification of program code.
- 22 (3) The occupational competency area of the
- 23 <u>classification of program code.</u>
- 24 (4) A description of the classification of program code.
- 25 (5) A list of skills that a student must attain in order
- to complete the classification of program code.
- 27 (6) Evidence of financial support for the classification
- of program code from the public school entity.
- 29 (7) Any additional information that the department deems
- 30 necessary to determine whether to approve or disapprove of

- 1 <u>the classification of program code.</u>
- 2 <u>Section 1903-H. Submission of applications.</u>
- 3 No later than January 31 of each year, a public school entity
- 4 may submit the application under section 1902-H to the
- 5 <u>department for approval or disapproval of a classification of</u>
- 6 program code.
- 7 <u>Section 1904-H. Notice of approval or denial of applications.</u>
- 8 (a) Notice. -- No later than May 31 of the year the department
- 9 receives an application under section 1902-H, the department
- 10 shall notify a public school entity which submitted the
- 11 application whether the department approved or denied the
- 12 <u>application</u>.
- (b) Posting. -- No later than June 15 of the year the
- 14 <u>department approved the application under subsection (a), the</u>
- 15 <u>department shall post the classification of program code on its</u>
- 16 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 17 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
