- 3 § 8501. Definitions.
- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 7 "Citation." A traffic citation, ticket or any other type of
- 8 citation.
- 9 "Enforcement officer." A municipal police officer,
- 10 Pennsylvania State Police officer, Game Commission officer, Fish
- 11 Commission officer or any other officer employed by a political
- 12 subdivision, regional police department or agency of the
- 13 Commonwealth.
- 14 "Points of contact." Any quantifiable contact made in the
- 15 furtherance of an enforcement officer's duties, including, but
- 16 not limited to, the number of traffic stops completed, arrests,
- 17 written warnings and crime prevention measures. The term shall
- 18 not include the issuance of citations or the number of citations
- 19 issued by an enforcement officer.
- 20 § 8502. Quotas prohibited.
- 21 (a) General rule. -- No political subdivision, regional police
- 22 department or agency of the Commonwealth shall have the power or
- 23 authority to order, mandate, require or in any other manner,
- 24 directly or indirectly, suggest to any enforcement officer that
- 25 the enforcement officer shall issue a certain number of
- 26 citations on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly or yearly
- 27 basis.
- 28 (b) Award not affected. -- The prohibition under subsection
- 29 (a) shall not affect the conditions of any Federal or State
- 30 grant or money awarded to a political subdivision, regional

- 1 police department or agency of the Commonwealth and used to fund
- 2 <u>traffic enforcement programs</u>.
- 3 § 8503. Station averaging prohibited.
- 4 (a) General rule. -- A political subdivision, regional police
- 5 department or agency of the Commonwealth may not for purposes of
- 6 <u>evaluating an enforcement officer's job performance compare the</u>
- 7 <u>number of citations issued by the enforcement officer to the</u>
- 8 <u>number of citations issued by any other enforcement officer who</u>
- 9 <u>has similar job duties.</u>
- 10 (b) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall prohibit
- 11 the evaluation of the job performance of an enforcement officer
- 12 <u>based on the enforcement officer's points of contact.</u>
- 13 <u>§ 8504. Violation.</u>
- 14 Any citation issued in violation of this chapter shall be
- 15 unenforceable, null and void.
- 16 Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 17 § 3371. Radar enforcement systems pilot program.
- 18 <u>(a) Establishment.--A pilot program is established to</u>
- 19 provide for the use of electronic devices in speed limit
- 20 <u>enforcement.</u>
- 21 (b) Authorization. -- Notwithstanding section 3368(c)(2) and
- 22 (5) (relating to speed timing devices), police officers are
- 23 authorized to enforce section 3362 (relating to maximum speed
- 24 <u>limits</u>) on municipal roads in a police officer's jurisdiction
- 25 <u>using electronic devices such as radio-microwave devices</u>,
- 26 commonly referred to as electronic speed meters or radar, or
- 27 <u>infrared laser light devices (commonly referred to as LIDAR), in</u>
- 28 <u>accordance with this section</u>. Enforcement of speed restrictions
- 29 under this section may be enforced by police officers on a
- 30 State-owned limited access or divided highway only if the

- 1 highway is patrolled by the local or regional police department
- 2 under the terms of an agreement with the Pennsylvania State
- 3 Police.
- 4 (c) Requirements for police officers.--Police officers using
- 5 electronic devices must:
- 6 (1) complete a training course approved by the
- 7 Pennsylvania State Police and the Municipal Police Officers'
- 8 Education and Training Commission; and
- 9 (2) operate the devices from a clearly marked vehicle.
- 10 (d) Conviction. -- No person may be convicted upon evidence
- 11 <u>obtained through the use of an electronic device used under this</u>
- 12 <u>section unless:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) The speed recorded is over 10 miles-per-hour in</u>
- excess of the legally posted speed limit.
- 15 (2) Official warning signs indicating the use of
- 16 <u>electronic devices by a police officer and worded "local</u>
- 17 police radar enforced" are erected within 500 feet of the
- 18 border of the political subdivision on the main arteries
- 19 entering that political subdivision.
- 20 (e) Classification, approval and testing of electronic
- 21 devices. -- Electronic devices used under this section shall be
- 22 subject to the provisions of section 3368(d) and must be tested
- 23 for accuracy within a period of one year prior to the alleged
- 24 violation in accordance with specifications prescribed by
- 25 National Highway Safety Administration standards. All electronic
- 26 devices used under this section must appear on the conforming
- 27 products list, in conjunction with National Highway Safety
- 28 Administration standards.
- 29 (f) Local ordinance required to enforce. -- Prior to employing
- 30 electronic devices under this section, the governing body of the

- 1 municipality must adopt an ordinance authorizing the use of
- 2 electronic devices by police officers on roadways under
- 3 <u>subsection</u> (b) within the boundaries of the municipality.
- 4 (g) Initial period. -- During the initial 90 days of speed
- 5 <u>enforcement using electronic devices</u>, <u>individuals may only be</u>
- 6 <u>sanctioned for violations with a written warning.</u>
- 7 (h) Revenue limit. -- A municipal share of revenue generated
- 8 from the use of an electronic device may not exceed an amount
- 9 <u>equal to 20% of the municipality's annual budget. All revenue</u>
- 10 collected in excess of this amount shall be remitted to the
- 11 <u>department for deposit in the Motor License Fund and shall be</u>
- 12 <u>appropriated by the General Assembly.</u>
- (i) Construction. -- This section shall not abrogate, limit,
- 14 restrict or diminish any authority granted by law to and
- 15 <u>exercised by the Pennsylvania State Police as of the effective</u>
- 16 date of this section.
- 17 (j) Expiration.--This section shall expire six years from
- 18 the effective date of this section.
- 19 Section 3. Repeals are as follows:
- 20 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
- 21 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 44
- 22 Pa.C.S. Pt. V.
- 23 (2) The act of October 30, 1981 (P.L.321, No.114),
- 24 entitled "An act prohibiting political subdivisions or
- agencies of the Commonwealth from imposing certain quotas on
- the issuance of citations for certain offenses," is repealed.
- 27 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 120 days.
