11	This chapter recognizes the contributions of veterans of the
12	United States Armed Forces from this Commonwealth in major
13	conflicts since the Vietnam War.
14	§ 1302. First Gulf War Veterans Day.
15	(a) Legislative findings and declarations The General
16	Assembly finds and declares as follows:
17	(1) On August 2, 1990, Saddam Hussein ordered Iraqi
18	troops to invade and occupy the sovereign nation of Kuwait.
19	(2) The United States led an international coalition
20	demanding Saddam Hussein to withdraw Iraqi forces from Kuwait
21	by January 15, 1991.
22	(3) After Iraq failed to meet the deadline, passed by
23	the United Nations Security Council, President George H. W.
24	Bush on January 16, 1991, ordered United States Armed Forces
25	to begin "Operation Desert Storm."
26	(4) On January 17, 750,000 coalition forces from 36
27	nations, including 540,000 United States Armed Forces, began
28	the battle to liberate Kuwait from occupation.
29	(5) After an intensive air campaign, coalition forces
30	liberated Kuwait City on February 28, 1991.

- 1 (6) On March 6, after negotiating a cease-fire,
- 2 <u>President Bush announced the end of combat operations.</u>
- 3 (7) By the end of the conflict, 200 United States Armed
- 4 Forces members were killed, including 29 from this
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 (8) The bravery of United States Armed Forces and their
- 7 <u>allies should be recognized for the liberation of Kuwait and</u>
- 8 <u>restoration of Kuwait's sovereignty as an independent nation.</u>
- 9 (b) Designation. -- March 6 of each year is designated as
- 10 "First Gulf War Veterans Day."
- 11 (c) Proclamation. -- The Governor shall issue annually a
- 12 proclamation encouraging all public schools and educational
- 13 <u>institutions to observe "First Gulf War Veterans Day" and to</u>
- 14 conduct exercises recognizing the contributions of all those
- 15 involved in the first Gulf War and remembering the sacrifices
- 16 they made for their country. The proclamation may not mandate a
- 17 public school or educational institution to participate in the
- 18 observance.
- 19 § 1303. Afghanistan War Veterans Day.
- 20 (a) Legislative findings and declarations. -- The General
- 21 Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 22 (1) The war in Afghanistan, which is America's longest
- 23 <u>conflict, began in 2001 and continues to this day.</u>
- 24 (2) Following the terrorist attacks on September 11,
- 25 2001, the United States demanded that the Taliban regime hand
- over Osama bin Laden and stop harboring Al Qaeda.
- 27 (3) President George W. Bush ordered United States Armed
- Forces to begin "Operation Enduring Freedom" to combat
- 29 terrorism in Afghanistan and confront Al Oaeda.
- 30 (4) United States Armed Forces first entered Afghanistan

- and began combat operations on October 7, 2001.
- 2 (5) On May 2, 2011, Osama bin Laden was killed during
- 3 the fighting after President Barack Obama ordered Navy SEALs
- 4 <u>to raid Osama bin Laden's compound.</u>
- 5 (6) On December 28, 2014, the United States and the
- 6 North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) combat operations
- 7 <u>in Afghanistan officially ended.</u>
- 8 (7) Since the beginning of Operation Enduring Freedom,
- 9 <u>over 830,000 Americans, including 18,000 from this</u>
- 10 Commonwealth, have served in Afghanistan.
- 11 (8) More than 2,000 members of the United States Armed
- 12 <u>Forces, including 98 from this Commonwealth, were killed in</u>
- 13 <u>action in Afghanistan since combat began.</u>
- 14 (9) More than 19,000 members of the United States Armed
- Forces were wounded in service to their country in
- 16 Afghanistan.
- 17 (b) Designation. -- October 7 of each year is designated as
- 18 "Afghanistan War Veterans Day."
- 19 (c) Proclamation. -- The Governor shall issue annually a
- 20 proclamation encouraging all public schools and educational
- 21 institutions to observe "Afghanistan War Veterans Day" and to
- 22 conduct exercises recognizing the contributions of all those
- 23 involved in the war in Afghanistan and remembering the
- 24 sacrifices they made for their country. The proclamation may not
- 25 mandate a public school or educational institution to
- 26 participate in the observance.
- 27 § 1304. Second Gulf War Veterans Day.
- 28 (a) Legislative findings and declarations. -- The General
- 29 Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 30 (1) The second Gulf War was fought from 2003 to 2008.

- 1 (2) On March 19, 2003, President George W. Bush
- 2 <u>announced the beginning of combat operations in Iraq after</u>
- 3 Saddam Hussein failed to meet the deadline for leaving Irag.
- 4 (3) On December 18, 2011, the last member of the United
- 5 <u>States Armed Forces left Iraq.</u>
- 6 (4) Since the beginning of "Operation Iraqi Freedom,"
- 7 <u>2.5 million Americans have served in Iraq.</u>
- 8 (5) More than 4,000 members of the United States Armed
- 9 Forces lost their lives during the second Gulf War, including
- 10 197 from this Commonwealth, and more than 32,000 were
- 11 <u>wounded.</u>
- 12 (b) Designation.--December 18 of each year is designated
- 13 <u>as "Second Gulf War Veterans Day."</u>
- (c) Proclamation. -- The Governor shall issue annually a
- 15 proclamation encouraging all public schools and educational
- 16 <u>institutions to observe "Second Gulf War Veterans Day" and to</u>
- 17 conduct exercises recognizing the contributions of all those
- 18 involved in the second Gulf War and remembering the sacrifices
- 19 they made for their country. The proclamation may not mandate a
- 20 public school or educational institution to participate in the
- 21 observance.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
