11	(c) Instructions to jury
12	(1) Before the jury retires to consider the sentencing
13	verdict, the court shall instruct the jury on the following
14	matters:
15	(i) The aggravating circumstances specified in
16	subsection (d) as to which there is some evidence.
17	(ii) The mitigating circumstances specified in
18	subsection (e) as to which there is some evidence.
19	(iii) Aggravating circumstances must be proved by

1 the Commonwealth beyond a reasonable doubt; mitigating 2 circumstances must be proved by the defendant by a 3 preponderance of the evidence.

[The] Except as provided under subparagraph 4 (iv) 5 (vi), the verdict must be a sentence of death if the jury unanimously finds at least one aggravating circumstance 6 7 specified in subsection (d) and no mitigating 8 circumstance or if the jury unanimously finds one or more 9 aggravating circumstances which outweigh any mitigating 10 circumstances. The verdict must be a sentence of life imprisonment in all other cases. 11

(v) The court may, in its discretion, discharge the jury if it is of the opinion that further deliberation will not result in a unanimous agreement as to the sentence <u>or an agreement as provided under subparagraph</u> (vi), in which case the court shall sentence the defendant to life imprisonment.

18(vi) The verdict must be a sentence of death if no19less than 11 jurors find the aggravating circumstance20specified under subsection (d)(1) and no mitigating
