AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the annual designation and holiday observance June 2 19 as "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" in this Commonwealth.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Legislative findings.
- 6 The General Assembly hereby finds and declares as follows:
- 7 (1) Originating in Galveston, Texas, on June 19, 1865,
- 8 when slaves in that state learned that they had been freed,
- 9 "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" is the oldest African-
- 10 American holiday observance in the United States.
- 11 (2) "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" commemorates the
- 12 survival instinct of Africans who endured a transatlantic
- journey, known as the Middle Passage, on slave ships from
- 14 their homeland to this country.
- 15 (3) Approximately 11.5 million Africans survived the
- harsh voyage to slave markets in the New World, and the slave

- 1 population in America grew quickly.
- 2 (4) "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" further
- 3 commemorates the impact of slavery, the abolition movement
- 4 and African-American emancipation in the United States and
- 5 has become a traditional celebration of independence, human
- 6 rights and African-American culture in many communities.
- 7 (5) Recognition of "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" in
- 8 this Commonwealth would encourage all governmental entities,
- 9 civic organizations, schools and institutions of higher
- 10 education in this Commonwealth to observe the day in a manner
- that emphasizes the meaning and importance of the end of
- 12 slavery in the United States and to recognize and celebrate
- the importance of this day to every person who cherishes
- liberty and equality for all people.
- 15 (6) "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" is celebrated
- annually in at least 37 states nationwide.
- 17 Section 2. Designation.
- June 19 is designated as "Juneteenth National Freedom Day" in
- 19 this Commonwealth.
- 20 Section 3. Construction.
- 21 Nothing in this act shall be construed as requiring an
- 22 employer to treat June 19 as a legal or official holiday or to
- 23 provide paid leave to an employee on June 19 solely by virtue of
- 24 the date being designated under this act.
- 25 Section 4. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
