## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
  - act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto, " in terms and courses of study,
- providing for child abuse awareness and prevention.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1528. Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention. -- (a)
- 13 Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, each school entity
- 14 shall:

- 15 (1) Develop an age-appropriate child abuse awareness and
- 16 prevention education program and incorporate such program into
- 17 the school entity's existing curriculum for students in
- 18 kindergarten through grade twelve. In developing the program,

- 1 the school entity shall use the model curriculum developed by
- 2 the department under subsection (b) (1).
- 3 (2) Include training in child abuse awareness and prevention
- 4 <u>in the professional development plan submitted by the school</u>
- 5 entity to the secretary for approval pursuant to section 1205.1;
- 6 provided that a school entity shall provide four (4) hours of
- 7 <u>such training every five (5) years for professional educators</u>
- 8 assigned to teach courses into which child abuse awareness and
- 9 prevention education has been incorporated under paragraph (1).
- 10 Training under this paragraph may be used to satisfy a
- 11 professional educator's continuing professional education
- 12 requirement under section 1205.2. A school entity shall use the
- 13 materials made available by the department under subsection (b)
- 14 (2) to conduct such training.
- 15 (b) The department, in consultation with the Department of
- 16 <u>Human Services and at least one organization addressing child</u>
- 17 abuse, shall:
- 18 (1) Develop a model child abuse awareness and prevention
- 19 curriculum, which may include materials already publicly
- 20 available, and make such curriculum available to all school
- 21 entities and, upon request, to nonpublic schools.
- 22 (2) Compile, develop and post on its publicly accessible
- 23 Internet website recommended quidelines and educational
- 24 materials for the training provided for under subsection (a) (2),
- 25 which may include materials already publicly available.
- 26 (c) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 27 <u>shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless</u>
- 28 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 29 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 30 Commonwealth.

- 1 "Nonpublic school." A nonprofit school, other than a school
- 2 <u>entity</u>, wherein a resident of this Commonwealth may legally
- 3 fulfill the compulsory school attendance requirements of this
- 4 act and which meets the requirements of Title VI of the Civil
- 5 Rights Act of 1964 (Public Law 88-352, 78 Stat. 241).
- 6 "Professional educator." As defined in section 1205.2(o).
- 7 "School entity." A school district, joint school district,
- 8 <u>charter school</u>, <u>regional charter school</u>, <u>cyber charter school</u>,
- 9 <u>intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school.</u>
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
