## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1
- act relating to the public school system, including certain 2
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the

- laws relating thereto," in books, furniture and supplies, providing for purchase and use of green cleaning products. 6
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 801.1. Purchase and Use of Green Cleaning
- Products. -- (a) The board of school directors of each school 1.3
- district shall purchase green cleaning products for use by
- public schools as is practical and economically feasible. Public 15
- 16 schools may exhaust existing cleaning products prior to the
- 17 purchase of green cleaning products.
- (b) The board of school directors of each school district 18
- shall develop and implement policies on the purchase and use of 19

- 1 green cleaning products by the effective date of this
- 2 <u>subsection</u>. The policies shall:
- 3 (1) require green cleaning products to be used by public
- 4 schools;
- 5 (2) establish purchasing policies of green cleaning products
- 6 that meet third-party certification standards, including:
- 7 (i) Green Seal, Green Label, Environmental Choice,
- 8 TerraChoice or Ecologo; or
- 9 (ii) any other nationally recognized independent third-party
- 10 entity that certifies environmentally preferable products that
- 11 the board of school directors determines to be appropriate;
- 12 (3) establish green cleaning practices, including storage,
- 13 application, frequency of use and disposal of supplies to ensure
- 14 that the occupants of a school building do not suffer any
- 15 adverse health effects as a result of these practices;
- 16 (4) provide a clear and accurate description of the
- 17 functional characteristics or nature of the green cleaning
- 18 products that are to be purchased; and
- 19 <u>(5) require training for staff on implementing the policies.</u>
- 20 (c) Policies developed and implemented according to this
- 21 section shall not preclude the use, when necessary, of a
- 22 disinfectant, disinfecting cleaner, sanitizer or another
- 23 <u>microbial product regulated by the Federal Insecticide</u>,
- 24 Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (61 Stat. 163, 7 U.S.C. § 136 et
- 25 seq.).
- 26 (d) On or before June 30 of each year, a board of school
- 27 <u>directors that does not purchase green cleaning products for use</u>
- 28 shall provide written notice of the board of school directors'
- 29 reasoning to the Department of Education.
- 30 (e) As used in this section, the following words and phrases

- 1 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 2 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 3 "Green cleaning products." Environmentally preferable
- 4 <u>cleaning and cleaning maintenance products and supplies intended</u>
- 5 for routine cleaning and cleaning maintenance that, at a
- 6 minimum, possess positive health and environmental attributes,
- 7 <u>including biodegradability</u>, low toxicity, low volatile organic
- 8 compound content, reduced packaging, low life cycle energy use
- 9 <u>and lesser or reduced effects on human health and the</u>
- 10 environment when compared to competing products that serve the
- 11 same purpose. The term includes general purpose cleaners,
- 12 <u>bathroom cleaners, carpet cleaners, glass cleaners, floor</u>
- 13 <u>cleaners</u>, floor finishes and floor strippers, wall cleaners,
- 14 desk cleaners, surface cleaners, window cleaners, whiteboard
- 15 cleaners and soap. The term does not include room deodorizers,
- 16 <u>air fresheners</u>, toilet deodorizers or hand cleaners.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
