AN ACT

1 Making appropriations from the General Fund to the Department of
2 Health for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and for
3 the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the
4 close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Appropriation
11 Act of 2019 - Department of Health.
