AN ACT

- 1 Providing for cytomegalovirus education and newborn testing <-2 SCREENING. <--</pre>
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the CMV Education
- 7 and Newborn Testing SCREENING Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Birthing facility." An inpatient or ambulatory health care
- 13 facility licensed by the department that provides birthing and
- 14 newborn care services.
- 15 "CMV." Cytomegalovirus.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 17 "Health care practitioner." The term shall have the same

- 1 meaning as defined in section 103 of the act of July 19, 1979
- 2 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 3 "Newborn child." A child under 28 days of age.
- 4 Section 3. Informational publications by department.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- The department shall make the following
- 6 available on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 7 website:
- 8 (1) Up-to-date, evidence-based information about CMV
- 9 that has been reviewed by medical experts and national CMV
- organizations. The information provided shall include the
- 11 following:
- 12 (i) The incidence of CMV.
- 13 (ii) The transmission of CMV to pregnant women and
- 14 women who may become pregnant.
- 15 (iii) Birth defects caused by congenital CMV.
- 16 (iv) Methods of diagnosing congenital CMV.
- 17 (v) Available preventive measures.
- 18 (vi) Treatment options.
- 19 (vii) Any other information the department deems
- 20 necessary.
- 21 (2) Contact information regarding support programs and
- 22 services, including the following:
- 23 (i) Information hotlines specific to CMV.
- 24 (ii) Relevant resource centers or clearinghouses.
- 25 (iii) National and local CMV organizations.
- 26 (iv) Educational and support programs.
- 27 (b) Form. -- The information provided in accordance with this
- 28 act shall conform to the applicable standard or standards
- 29 provided in the enhanced "National Standards for Culturally and
- 30 Linguistically Appropriate Services in Health and Health Care,"

- 1 as adopted by the United States Department of Health and Human
- 2 Services and published in the Federal Register on September 24,
- 3 2013.
- 4 Section 4. Dissemination of information on CMV.
- 5 (a) Requirement.--A health care practitioner that assumes
- 6 responsibility for the prenatal care of a pregnant woman or a
- 7 woman who may become pregnant shall provide the educational
- 8 information regarding CMV made available by the department under
- 9 section 3.
- 10 (b) Compliance. -- Delivery of information prepared by the
- 11 department in accordance with section 3 shall constitute
- 12 compliance with this section.
- 13 Section 5. CMV newborn testing SCREENING.
- 14 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided for in subsection
- 15 (b), the department shall require a birthing facility or a
- 16 health care practitioner that assumes care of a newborn child to
- 17 test SCREEN the newborn child for CMV before the newborn child <-

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- 18 is 21 days of age if:
- 19 (1) The THE newborn child fails the newborn hearing
- screening under the act of November 30, 2001 (P.L.849,
- No.89), known as the Infant Hearing Education, Assessment,
- 22 Reporting and Referral (IHEARR) Act-; OR
- 23 (2) The THE parent or guardian of a newborn child <--
- 24 requests that the newborn child be tested SCREENED for CMV. <--
- 25 (b) Exception.--A test SCREENING under subsection (a) may <--
- 26 not be performed if a parent or quardian of the newborn child
- 27 dissents on the grounds that the test SCREENING conflicts with a <--
- 28 religious belief or practice.
- 29 Section 6. Regulations.
- 30 The department shall promulgate regulations necessary to

- 1 effectuate the provisions of this act.
- 2 Section 7. Effective date.
- 3 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
