## AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An  
2 act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and  
3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and  
4 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and  
5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,  
6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding  
7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic  
8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the  
9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and  
10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing  
11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,  
12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective  
13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain  
14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure  
15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;  
16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in  
17 licenses and regulations, liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed  
18 beverages, further providing for wine expanded permits.

19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
20 hereby enacts as follows:

21 Section 1. Section 415(d) of the act of April 12, 1951  
22 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, is amended to read:

23 Section 415. Wine Expanded Permits.--\* \* \*

24 (d) A wine expanded permit holder may sell for off-premises  
25 consumption, in a single transaction, up to [three thousand

1 (3,000)] ~~six thousand (6,000)~~ NINE THOUSAND (9,000) milliliters <--

2 of wine.

4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
