AN ACT

1 Designating a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 96
2 over the Little Wills Creek, Bedford County, as the Staff
3 Sgt. Roger (Rod) Guy Holler Memorial Bridge.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Staff Sgt. Roger (Rod) Guy Holler Memorial Bridge.

7 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
8 follows:

9 (1) Staff Sgt. Roger Guy Holler, of Buffalo Mills, was a
10 1967 graduate of Hyndman High School where he was a varsity
11 wrestler and was in the chorus.

12 (2) Staff Sgt. Holler attended Penn State Altoona and
13 was attending Pittsburgh Technical Institute when he was
14 drafted into the United States Army in June 1969.

15 (3) Staff Sgt. Holler completed basic training at Fort
16 Polk in Louisiana and Fort Benning in Georgia.

1 (4) While in Vietnam, Staff Sgt. Holler was a member of
2 Company A, 2nd Battalion, 5th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division.

3 (5) On January 16, 1971, Staff Sgt. Holler was killed by
4 artillery fire in Bien Hoa, Vietnam.

5 (6) Staff Sgt. Holler was awarded the Silver Star, the
6 Air Medal, the Army Commendation Medal and the Purple Heart.

7 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on that portion of
8 Pennsylvania Route 96 over the Little Wills Creek, Bedford
9 County, is designated the Staff Sgt. Roger (Rod) Guy Holler
10 Memorial Bridge.

11 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
12 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
13 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

14 Section 2. Effective date.

15 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
