AN ACT

- 1 Prohibiting the use of taxpayer funds for inmate gender-2 confirmation surgery and hormone therapy.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Inmate Sex
- 7 Change Prevention Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Gender-confirmation surgery." Any of the several surgical
- 13 procedures that transgender persons may undergo in order to
- 14 obtain the physical characteristics that match their gender
- 15 identity.
- 16 "Inmate." A person committed to a term of imprisonment or
- 17 otherwise confined under the custody of the Commonwealth in a

- 1 State correctional institution.
- 2 Section 3. Prohibition and costs.
- 3 (a) Prohibition. -- No expenditure for an inmate's gender-
- 4 confirmation surgery or hormone therapy shall be made by the
- 5 Department of Corrections or any other Commonwealth agency,
- 6 directly or indirectly, from money appropriated, executively
- 7 authorized or otherwise made available from the General Fund or
- 8 a special fund that is comprised of money collected by a tax
- 9 imposed by the Commonwealth or other revenues or receipts
- 10 received by the Commonwealth from taxpayers.
- 11 (b) Costs.--Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 12 contrary, if gender-confirmation surgery or hormone therapy is
- 13 approved or recommended by the medical provider of an inmate
- 14 diagnosed with gender dysphoria, the inmate shall be responsible
- 15 for the payment of all costs associated with the gender-
- 16 confirmation surgery or hormone therapy.
- 17 Section 4. Effective date.
- 18 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
