## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 22, 1933 (P.L.853, No.155), entitled "An 1 act relating to taxation; designating the subjects, property and persons subject to and exempt from taxation for all local 3 purposes; providing for and regulating the assessment and valuation of persons, property and subjects of taxation for county purposes, and for the use of those municipal and 5 6 quasi-municipal corporations which levy their taxes on county 7 assessments and valuations; amending, revising and consolidating the law relating thereto; and repealing 9 existing laws," in subjects of taxation and exemptions, 10 further providing for exemptions from taxation. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 13 14 Section 1. Section 204(a) of the act of May 22, 1933 15 (P.L.853, No.155), known as The General County Assessment Law, is amended by adding a clause to read: 16 17 Section 204. Exemptions from Taxation. -- (a) The following 18 property shall be exempt from all county, city, borough, town, township, road, poor and school tax, to wit: 19 20
- 21 (14) All solar energy devices on real property in this

- 1 Commonwealth, whether or not affixed to real property. The term
- 2 <u>"solar energy device" shall mean a system or series of</u>
- 3 mechanisms designed primarily to provide heating or cooling or
- 4 to produce electrical or mechanical power by collecting and
- 5 <u>transferring solar-generated energy</u>. The term includes a
- 6 <u>mechanical or chemical device that has the ability to store</u>
- 7 solar-generated energy for use in heating or cooling or in the
- 8 production of power.

- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
