## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in obstructing governmental
- operations, further providing for the offense of resisting
- arrest or other law enforcement.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 5104 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 9 § 5104. Resisting arrest or other law enforcement.
- 10 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits a misdemeanor of the
- 11 second degree if, with the intent of preventing a public servant
- 12 from effecting a lawful arrest or discharging any other duty,
- 13 the person [creates a substantial risk of bodily injury to the
- 14 public servant or anyone else, or employs means justifying or
- 15 requiring substantial force to overcome the resistance.]
- 16 attempts to inflict or causes bodily harm to a public servant or
- 17 another person or otherwise engages in physically resistant
- 18 behavior that would require force to be utilized to overcome the
- 19 resistance.

- 1 (b) Threats.--A person commits a misdemeanor of the third
- 2 <u>degree if</u>, with the intent of preventing a public servant from
- 3 effecting a lawful arrest or discharging any other duty, the
- 4 person threatens, by word or menace, to cause bodily harm to a
- 5 <u>public servant or another person; or otherwise engages in</u>
- 6 <u>destructive behavior that would require force to be utilized to</u>
- 7 overcome the resistance.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
