Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 20 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," IN ORGANIZATION OF DEPARTMENTAL ADMINISTRATIVE 21 BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS AND OF ADVISORY BOARDS AND 22 23 COMMISSIONS, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR STATE GEOSPATIAL COORDINATING BOARD; IN INDEPENDENT FISCAL OFFICE, FURTHER 24 PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL DUTIES; AND providing for COVID-19 25 debt cost reduction review. 26 27 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 28 hereby enacts as follows: 29 Section 1. - 18 LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL REPRESENTING A SUBURBAN COMMUNITY]
- 19 OFFICIALS OR EMPLOYEES.
- 20 (VIII) THREE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
- 21 OF REPRESENTATIVES IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MAJORITY LEADER AND
- 22 MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. ONE MEMBER
- 23 SHALL BE A LOCAL [ELECTED] GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYE
- 24 REPRESENTING AN URBAN COMMUNITY. ONE MEMBER SHALL BE AN EMPLOYE
- 25 OF A COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY. ONE MEMBER SHALL BE AN
- 26 INDIVIDUAL WITH EXPERTISE IN GEOSPATIAL TECHNOLOGY.

- 28 (F.1) THE BOARD MAY, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR,
- 29 APPOINT AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WHO SHALL SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF
- 30 THE BOARD. THE SELECTION AND REMOVAL OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

- 1 SHALL BE MADE BY A SIMPLE MAJORITY OF THE VOTING MEMBERS OF THE
- 2 BOARD THAT CONSTITUTE A QUORUM. COMPENSATION FOR THE EXECUTIVE
- 3 DIRECTOR SHALL BE SET BY A VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE BOARD
- 4 MEMBERS IDENTIFIED IN SUBSECTION (B) (1) (I), (II), (III), (IV),
- 5 (V), (VI) AND (VI.1), SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE EXECUTIVE
- 6 BOARD. FUNDING FOR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S COMPENSATION SHALL
- 7 BE EVENLY APPORTIONED AMONGST ALL OF THE COMMONWEALTH AGENCIES
- 8 REPRESENTED BY MEMBERS IN SUBSECTION (B) (1) (I), (II), (III),
- 9 (IV), (V), (VI) AND (VI.1) AND ADMINISTERED BY THE GOVERNOR'S
- 10 BUDGET OFFICE. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL BE QUALIFIED FOR THE
- 11 DUTIES OF THE POSITION, AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD, AND SHALL
- 12 CONDUCT THE WORK OF THE BOARD UNDER THE BOARD'S DIRECTION AND
- 13 SUPERVISION. NO CURRENT MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY SERVE AS THE
- 14 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S APPOINTMENT SHALL
- 15 NOT CONTINUE BEYOND THE EXPIRATION OF THIS SECTION. THE
- 16 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE SAME POLICIES AND
- 17 PROCEDURES AS EMPLOYES OF THE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATION.

- 20 SECTION 2. SECTION 615-B(A) OF THE ACT IS AMENDED AND THE
- 21 SECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SUBSECTION TO READ:
- 22 SECTION 615-B. ADDITIONAL DUTIES.
- 23 (A) ACTUARIAL NOTES. -- THE OFFICE SHALL PREPARE ACTUARIAL
- 24 NOTES BY SELECTING AN ENROLLED PENSION ACTUARY TO PREPARE [AN
- 25 ACTUARIAL NOTE] ACTUARIAL NOTES FOR BILLS OR AMENDMENTS WHICH
- 26 COULD HAVE A MATERIAL ACTUARIAL IMPACT ON A PUBLIC EMPLOYEE
- 27 RETIREMENT PLAN. ACTUARIAL NOTES SHALL INCLUDE A RELIABLE
- 28 ESTIMATE OF THE FINANCIAL AND ACTUARIAL EFFECT OF THE PROPOSED
- 29 CHANGE IN ANY PENSION OR RETIREMENT SYSTEM. THE FINANCIAL
- 30 ANALYSIS CONTAINED IN ACTUARIAL NOTES FOR LEGISLATION THAT

- 1 PROPOSES SUBSTANTIAL BENEFIT DESIGN CHANGES UNDER 24 PA.C.S. PT.
- 2 IV (RELATING TO RETIREMENT FOR SCHOOL EMPLOYEES) AND 71 PA.C.S.
- 3 PT. XXV (RELATING TO RETIREMENT FOR STATE EMPLOYEES AND
- 4 OFFICERS) SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, A RISK TRANSFER
- 5 ANALYSIS AND, IF REQUESTED BY AN OFFICER LISTED IN THIS
- 6 SUBSECTION, AN ANALYSIS OF THE POTENTIAL IMPACT ON THE ASSET
- 7 ALLOCATION AND RELATED COSTS FOR THE SYSTEMS. THE ACTUARIAL NOTE
- 8 SHALL BE FACTUAL, AND SHALL, IF POSSIBLE, PROVIDE A RELIABLE
- 9 ESTIMATE OF BOTH THE IMMEDIATE COST AND EFFECT OF THE BILL AND,
- 10 IF DETERMINABLE OR REASONABLY FORSEEABLE, THE LONG-RANGE
- 11 ACTUARIAL COST AND EFFECT OF THE BILL. THE STATE EMPLOYEES'
- 12 <u>RETIREMENT SYSTEM OR THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT</u>
- 13 SYSTEM SHALL PROVIDE THE OFFICE WITH ALL INFORMATION NECESSARY
- 14 TO COMPLETE AN ACTUARIAL NOTE WITHIN 14 DAYS OF THE REQUEST FOR
- 15 <u>INFORMATION BY THE OFFICE</u>. THE OFFICE SHALL TRANSMIT ACTUARIAL
- 16 NOTES IN ELECTRONIC FORM TO THE GOVERNOR AND ALL MEMBERS OF THE
- 17 GENERAL ASSEMBLY WITHIN THE TIME PERIODS SPECIFIED UNDER THIS
- 18 SECTION UPON THE REQUEST OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 19 (1) THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE OR THE
- 20 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 21 (2) THE MAJORITY LEADER OR THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE
- 22 SENATE.
- 23 (3) THE MAJORITY LEADER OR THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE
- 24 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 25 (4) THE CHAIRPERSON OR MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
- 26 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE.
- 27 (5) THE CHAIRPERSON OR MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
- 28 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 29 (6) THE CHAIRPERSON OR MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
- 30 STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE TO WHICH THE BILL IS

- 2 (7) THE CHAIRPERSON OR MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE

- 6 (L) SUBMISSION OF BASELINE DATA. -- NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 1,
- 7 2020, JULY 31, 2021, AND JULY 31 OF EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE
- 8 STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND THE PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 9 EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM SHALL EACH SUBMIT TO THE OFFICE
- 10 <u>DATA SHOWING THE 30-YEAR BASELINE PROJECTIONS FOR THE RETIREMENT</u>
- 11 SYSTEMS BASED ON THE STATE LAW IN EFFECT AT THE TIME OF THE
- 12 SUBMISSION. THE OFFICE MAY SPECIFY THE DATA FIELDS AND THE FILE
- 13 FORMAT FOR THE DATA TO BE TRANSMITTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 14 DATA SUBMITTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE PROJECTIONS
- 15 WHICH SIMULATE A 1.0 PERCENTAGE POINT INCREASE AND A 1.0
- 16 PERCENTAGE POINT DECREASE TO THE OFFICIAL ASSUMED RATE OF RETURN
- 17 USED BY EACH RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
- 18 SECTION 2 3. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING AN ARTICLE TO

- 21 COVID-19 DEBT COST REDUCTION REVIEW
- 22 <u>Section 2101-C. Review of refinancing opportunities.</u>
- 23 The Treasury Department, in conjunction with the Secretary of
- 24 the Budget, the Auditor General and any chairperson of an
- 25 authority, commission, agency, OR board or other State <--
- 26 authorized entity that has the power to issue debt, shall
- 27 identify and review all outstanding debt obligations of the
- 28 Commonwealth and its authorities, commissions, agencies, OR <--
- 29 boards or other State authorized entities and submit a report of <--
- 30 the findings to the General Assembly no later than June OCTOBER <--

- 1 30, 2020. In addition to the identification and review of all

- 13 (3) DESCRIPTION OF EACH OBLIGATION, IDENTIFYING SENIOR
- OR SUBORDINATE DEBT AND FEDERAL TAX TREATMENT.
- 15 <u>(4) ACCOUNT OF ALL SECURITY PLEDGED FOR EACH OBLIGATION.</u>
- 16 (5) MOST RECENT RATING ASSOCIATED WITH EACH DEBT
- 17 OBLIGATION, INCLUDING RATE COVENANT AND MATURITY DATE.
- 18 (6) LIST OF ALL ADDITIONAL ASSOCIATED AGENCY OBLIGATIONS
- 19 OR COVENANTS.
- 20 (7) ANNUAL DEBT SERVICE COST, DEBT SERVICE FUND AND DEBT
- 21 SERVICE RESERVE FUND FOR EACH DEBT OBLIGATION.
- 22 (8) RISK FACTORS AND DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS ASSOCIATED
- 23 WITH EACH DEBT OBLIGATION.
- 24 (9) PENDING LITIGATION THAT MAY FINANCIALLY IMPACT THE
- 25 DEBT OBLIGATIONS OF THE AGENCY.
