## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for broadband services.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 68 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:
8	CHAPTER 82

12	8202. Broadband services.
13	<u>§ 8201. Definitions.</u>
14	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
15	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:
17	"Broadband facilities." Wires, cables, materials, equipment

1	and other facilities, which are or can be used for the provision
2	of broadband services.
3	"Broadband service supplier." An electricity,
4	telecommunications or Internet supplier or affiliate that
5	constructs, owns or installs new broadband facilities to provide
6	broadband services, at wholesale or retail, through existing
7	electric infrastructure within an easement. The term includes
8	third parties with which the electricity supplier contracts,
9	licenses or otherwise enters into agreements with for the
10	installation, service or maintenance of broadband infrastructure
11	and provision of broadband services on behalf of the electricity
12	<u>supplier or affiliate.</u>
13	"Broadband services." As follows:
14	(1) Service that consists of or includes the provision
15	of broadband that:
16	(i) is used to provide access to the Internet; or
17	(ii) provides computer processing, information
18	storage, information content or protocol conversion.
19	(2) The term includes the provision of video services,
20	voice over Internet protocol services, wireless services and
21	Internet protocol-enabled services.
22	"Easement." A recorded or unrecorded right-of-way, easement
23	or similar property right acquired by eminent domain,
24	prescription or conveyance that is used or may be used for
25	transmitting, distributing or providing electric service by
26	utilizing electric infrastructure.
27	"Electric cooperative corporation." As defined in 15 Pa.C.S.
28	<u>§ 7302(a) (relating to application of chapter).</u>
29	"Electricity supplier." A person engaged in providing
30	electricity, at wholesale or retail, including a public utility,

1 <u>municipal corporation or authority or an electric cooperative</u>

3 <u>§ 8202. Broadband services.</u>

4 (a) Broadband facilities.--The following apply:

5 (1) An electric cooperative corporation or an affiliate 6 of an electric cooperative corporation may provide broadband services or construct, operate and maintain broadband 7 facilities through an existing easement owned, held or used 8 9 by the electric cooperative corporation. (2) Except as provided for under subsection (b), the 10 attachment of broadband facilities shall not constitute a 11 change to the physical use of the easement, interfere with or 12 impair any vested rights of the property owner subject to the 13 14 easement or place an additional burden on the property or 15 interests of the owner. (3) A broadband service supplier that is not an electric 16 cooperative corporation may access and attach broadband 17 facilities within an electric cooperative's easement: 18 19 (i) if an electric cooperative or its affiliates 20 have attached broadband facilities to provide retail or wholesale broadband services; and 21 22 (ii) subject to the terms of applicable safety 23 standards, the structural integrity of the electric 24 infrastructure and the electric cooperative corporation's 25 rules and fees for the attachments. 26 (b) Exception.--Subsection (a) (2) shall not apply to the attachment of broadband facilities that are additional 27 freestanding or ground-based structures within the easement. 28 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
