AN ACT

Amending the act of July 10, 1981 (P.L.234, No.76), entitled "An 1 act providing limited civil and criminal immunity to persons 2 donating food to charitable or religious organizations for 3 distribution to needy persons and imposing certain powers and duties on counties," further providing for donor immunity. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 4(b) 4 of the act of July 10, 1981 8 <--(P.L.234, No.76), known as the Donated Food Limited Liability 10 Act, is amended to read: 11 Section 4. Donor immunity. * * * 12 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF 13 <--14 LAW, ANY PERSON WHO, IN GOOD FAITH, DONATES FOOD [TO A 15 CHARITABLE OR RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION] FOR ULTIMATE FREE DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY INDIVIDUALS, SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO 16 CRIMINAL OR CIVIL LIABILITY ARISING FROM THE CONDITION OF SUCH 17 FOOD, IF THE DONOR REASONABLY INSPECTS THE FOOD AT THE TIME OF 18

- 1 DONATION AND FINDS THE FOOD FIT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION. THE
- 2 IMMUNITY PROVIDED BY THIS SUBSECTION SHALL NOT EXTEND TO DONORS
- 3 WHERE DAMAGES RESULT FROM THE NEGLIGENCE, RECKLESSNESS OR
- 4 INTENTIONAL MISCONDUCT OF THE DONOR, OR IF THE DONOR HAS, OR
- 5 SHOULD HAVE HAD, ACTUAL OR CONSTRUCTIVE KNOWLEDGE THAT THE FOOD
- 6 IS TAINTED, CONTAMINATED OR HARMFUL TO THE HEALTH OR WELL-BEING
- 7 OF THE ULTIMATE RECIPIENT.
- 8 (b) Condition of food. -- The immunity provided by this
- 9 section is applicable to the good faith donation of food not
- 10 readily marketable due to considerations not [effecting]
- 11 <u>affecting</u> its fitness for human consumption, including, but not
- 12 limited to, appearance, AGE, freshness, grade [or], surplus OR <--
- 13 LABELED DATE CODE RECOMMENDED BY THE MANUFACTURER, but shall not
- 14 be deemed or construed to restrict the authority of any
- 15 authorized agency to otherwise regulate or ban the use of such
- 16 food for human consumption. The following shall apply:
- 17 (1) No person that donates food as permitted by law may

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- 18 be subject to civil or criminal liability or penalty for
- 19 violation of any laws, regulations or ordinances regulating
- 20 the labeling or packaging of the donated product or, with
- 21 respect to any other laws, regulations or ordinances, for a
- 22 <u>violation occurring after the time of the donation.</u>
- 23 (2) No person that donates food that is fit for human
- 24 consumption but has exceeded the labeled date code
- 25 recommended by the manufacturer may be subject to criminal or
- 26 civil liability arising from the condition of the food if the
- 27 <u>person that distributes the food to the end recipient makes a</u>
- 28 good faith evaluation that the food to be donated is fit for
- 29 <u>human consumption in accordance with this act.</u>
- 30 (3) A donation under this subsection shall not be

- 1 <u>considered negligent or reckless.</u>
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
