#### AN ACT

Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania <--1 2 Consolidated Statutes, in incurring debt and issuing bonds 3 and notes, providing for emergency tax anticipation notes. AMENDING THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.343, NO.176), ENTITLED <---4 "AN ACT RELATING TO THE FINANCES OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT; 5 PROVIDING FOR CANCER CONTROL, PREVENTION AND RESEARCH, FOR 6 AMBULATORY SURGICAL CENTER DATA COLLECTION, FOR THE JOINT 7 UNDERWRITING ASSOCIATION, FOR ENTERTAINMENT BUSINESS 8 FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT FIRMS, FOR PRIVATE DAM FINANCIAL 9 ASSURANCE AND FOR REINSTATEMENT OF ITEM VETOES; PROVIDING FOR 10 THE SETTLEMENT, ASSESSMENT, COLLECTION, AND LIEN OF TAXES, 11 BONUS, AND ALL OTHER ACCOUNTS DUE THE COMMONWEALTH, THE 12 COLLECTION AND RECOVERY OF FEES AND OTHER MONEY OR PROPERTY 13 DUE OR BELONGING TO THE COMMONWEALTH, OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF, 14 INCLUDING ESCHEATED PROPERTY AND THE PROCEEDS OF ITS SALE, 15 THE CUSTODY AND DISBURSEMENT OR OTHER DISPOSITION OF FUNDS 16 AND SECURITIES BELONGING TO OR IN THE POSSESSION OF THE 17 COMMONWEALTH, AND THE SETTLEMENT OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE 18 COMMONWEALTH, THE RESETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND APPEALS TO THE 19 COURTS, REFUNDS OF MONEYS ERRONEOUSLY PAID TO THE 20 21 COMMONWEALTH, AUDITING THE ACCOUNTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND ALL AGENCIES THEREOF, OF ALL PUBLIC OFFICERS COLLECTING 22 MONEYS PAYABLE TO THE COMMONWEALTH, OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF, 23 AND ALL RECEIPTS OF APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE COMMONWEALTH, 24 AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO ISSUE TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES 25 TO DEFRAY CURRENT EXPENSES, IMPLEMENTING THE PROVISIONS OF 26 SECTION 7 (A) OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF 27 28 PENNSYLVANIA AUTHORIZING AND RESTRICTING THE INCURRING OF CERTAIN DEBT AND IMPOSING PENALTIES; AFFECTING EVERY 29 DEPARTMENT, BOARD, COMMISSION, AND OFFICER OF THE STATE 30 GOVERNMENT, EVERY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, AND 31 32 CERTAIN OFFICERS OF SUCH SUBDIVISIONS, EVERY PERSON,

ASSOCIATION, AND CORPORATION REQUIRED TO PAY, ASSESS, OR 1 COLLECT TAXES, OR TO MAKE RETURNS OR REPORTS UNDER THE LAWS 2 IMPOSING TAXES FOR STATE PURPOSES, OR TO PAY LICENSE FEES OR 3 OTHER MONEYS TO THE COMMONWEALTH, OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF, 4 EVERY STATE DEPOSITORY AND EVERY DEBTOR OR CREDITOR OF THE 5 COMMONWEALTH," IN EMERGENCY COVID-19 RESPONSE, FURTHER 6 PROVIDING FOR MONEY IN ACCOUNT AND PROVIDING FOR 7 MUNICIPALITIES; IN FINANCIALLY DISTRESSED MUNICIPALITIES, 8 PROVIDING FOR LOCAL SERVICES TAX; IN SPECIAL FUNDS, FURTHER 9 PROVIDING FOR DISPOSITION OF BUDGET STABILIZATION RESERVE 10 FUND; IN ADDITIONAL SPECIAL FUNDS AND RESTRICTED ACCOUNTS, 11 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR RETURN OF COVID-19 RESPONSE TRANSFERS 12 AND PROVIDING FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION SECURITY FUND 13 TRANSFER; IN GENERAL BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION, FURTHER PROVIDING 14 FOR DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, FOR 15 DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES, FOR 16 DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, FOR DEPARTMENT OF 17 GENERAL SERVICES, FOR PENNSYLVANIA GAMING CONTROL BOARD, FOR 18 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, FOR DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS 19 AFFAIRS, FOR DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND FOR DEPARTMENT 20 OF REVENUE AND PROVIDING FOR LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT AND FOR 21 PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR 22 2020-2021 BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION AND FOR 2020-2021 23 RESTRICTIONS ON APPROPRIATIONS FOR FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS; MAKING 24 25 RELATED REPEALS; AND MAKING EDITORIAL CHANGES. 26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 27 hereby enacts as follows: 28 Section 1. Title 53 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated <---29 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 30 § 8121.1. Emergency tax anticipation notes. (a) Legislative findings. The General Assembly finds and 31 declares that the proclamation of disaster emergency issued by 32 33 the Governor on March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 34 21, 2020), and the resulting global pandemic from COVID-19, has 35 had an unexpected and sudden effect on the citizens, governments 36 and businesses of the Commonwealth, including a material negative effect on the revenues of many local government units. 37 38 (b) Emergency borrowing authorized. Notwithstanding any 39 other provision of this title or law, a local government unit 40 may borrow money under section 8121 (relating to power to issue tax anticipation notes) with the following additional terms: 41 (1) For the purposes of this subsection, the governing 42

1	body's anticipation of current taxes or current revenues may
2	include an anticipation that the taxes levied or revenues
3	receivable may not be received, in full or in part, until
4	after the end of the current fiscal year due to the extension
5	of tax filing deadlines, administrative break-down during the
6	proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
7	March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020),
8	and any renewal of the state of disaster emergency,
9	unexpected severe economic contraction or the inability to
10	timely enforce collection due to the proclamation of disaster
11	emergency.
12	(2) In addition to the other requirements under this
13	subchapter, a governing body shall establish a maturity date
14	for a tax anticipation note issued under this subsection
15	which shall not be later than the last day of the following <
16	fiscal year of the local government which ends not less than
17	15 months nor more than 26 months following the effective
18	<pre>date of this subsection. LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT'S FISCAL YEAR_ &lt;</pre>
19	<u>IN-2022.</u>
20	(c) Expiration. No local government unit may borrow money
21	under the authorization of this section after December 31, 2021.
22	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
23	SECTION 1. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS <
24	FOLLOWS:
25	(1) THE INTENT OF THIS ACT IS TO PROVIDE FOR THE
26	IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 2020-2021 COMMONWEALTH BUDGET.
27	(2) THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA CONFERS NUMEROUS
28	EXPRESS DUTIES UPON THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, INCLUDING THE
29	PASSAGE OF A BALANCED BUDGET FOR THE COMMONWEALTH.
30	(3) SECTION 24 OF ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION OF
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1 PENNSYLVANIA REQUIRES THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ADOPT ALL 2 APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF GOVERNMENT IN THIS 3 COMMONWEALTH, REGARDLESS OF THEIR SOURCE. THE SUPREME COURT 4 HAS REPEATEDLY AFFIRMED THAT "IT IS FUNDAMENTAL WITHIN 5 PENNSYLVANIA'S TRIPARTITE SYSTEM THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ENACTS THE LEGISLATION ESTABLISHING THOSE PROGRAMS WHICH THE 6 7 STATE PROVIDES FOR ITS CITIZENS AND APPROPRIATES THE FUNDS 8 NECESSARY FOR THEIR OPERATION."

9 (4) PURSUANT TO SECTION 13 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE 10 CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS EXPLICITLY REQUIRED TO ADOPT A BALANCED COMMONWEALTH BUDGET. 11 12 GIVEN THE UNPREDICTABILITY AND POTENTIAL INSUFFICIENCY OF 13 REVENUE COLLECTIONS, VARIOUS CHANGES IN STATE LAW RELATING TO 14 SOURCES OF REVENUE, THE COLLECTION OF REVENUE AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF STATUTES WHICH IMPACT REVENUE MAY BE 15 16 REOUIRED TO DISCHARGE THIS CONSTITUTIONAL OBLIGATION.

SECTION 11 OF ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION OF 17 (5) 18 PENNSYLVANIA REQUIRES THE ADOPTION OF A GENERAL APPROPRIATION 19 ACT THAT EMBRACES "NOTHING BUT APPROPRIATIONS." WHILE ACTUAL ITEMS OF APPROPRIATION CAN BE CONTAINED IN A GENERAL 20 21 APPROPRIATION ACT, THE ACHIEVEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A 22 COMPREHENSIVE BUDGET INVOLVES MORE THAN SUBJECTS OF 23 APPROPRIATIONS AND DOLLAR AMOUNTS. ULTIMATELY, THE BUDGET HAS 24 TO BE BALANCED UNDER SECTION 13 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA. THIS MAY NECESSITATE CHANGES TO 25 26 SOURCES OF FUNDING AND ENACTMENT OF STATUTES TO ACHIEVE FULL COMPLIANCE WITH THESE CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS. 27

(6) FOR THE REASONS SET FORTH IN PARAGRAPHS (1), (2),
(3), (4) AND (5), IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
THROUGH THIS ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE

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1 2020-2021 COMMONWEALTH BUDGET.

2 (7) EVERY PROVISION OF THIS ACT RELATES TO THE 3 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OPERATING BUDGET OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THIS FISCAL YEAR, ADDRESSING IN VARIOUS WAYS THE FISCAL 4 5 OPERATIONS, REVENUES AND POTENTIAL LIABILITIES OF THE 6 COMMONWEALTH. TO THAT END, THIS ACT IS INTENDED TO IMPLEMENT 7 THE 2020-2021 COMMONWEALTH BUDGET WITHOUT SPECIFICALLY 8 APPROPRIATING PUBLIC MONEY FROM THE GENERAL FUND. THIS ACT 9 PROVIDES ACCOUNTABILITY FOR SPENDING AND MAKES TRANSFERS OR 10 OTHER CHANGES NECESSARY TO IMPACT THE AVAILABILITY OF REVENUE IN ORDER TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 13 OF ARTICLE 11 VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA AND TO IMPLEMENT THE 12 13 ACT OF MAY 29, 2020 (P.L. , NO.1A), KNOWN AS THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 2020, AND THE ACT OF (P.L., NO.), 14 15 KNOWN AS THE SUPPLEMENT TO THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 16 2020.
