AN ACT

- Exempting small, minority-owned and women-owned businesses from the payment of certain business fees.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 7 Disadvantaged Business Fee Exemption Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Business fee." A fee required to be paid to the
- 13 Commonwealth or a political subdivision for starting or opening
- 14 a business in this Commonwealth. The term does not include a fee
- 15 for maintaining a license or other requirement for continuing to
- 16 operate a business.
- 17 "Department." The Department of General Services of the

- 1 Commonwealth.
- 2 "Disadvantaged business." A minority-owned business or
- 3 women-owned business with less than 100 employees that has been
- 4 certified as a disadvantaged business by a third-party
- 5 certifying organization.
- 6 "Third-party certifying organization." An organization that
- 7 certifies a business as a minority-owned business or women-owned
- 8 business as authorized by the department.
- 9 Section 3. Fee exemption.
- 10 (a) Fee exemption. -- A disadvantaged business shall be exempt
- 11 from the payment of business fees.
- 12 (b) Proof of status. -- In order to be eliqible for the fee
- 13 exemption under subsection (a), a disadvantaged business must
- 14 provide the department or the licensing authority of a political
- 15 subdivision to which the owner is applying with proof of the
- 16 business's status as a disadvantaged business by providing
- 17 certification from a third-party certification organization.
- 18 (c) Status. -- The Bureau of Diversity, Inclusion and Small
- 19 Business Opportunities of the department, in consultation with
- 20 other Commonwealth agencies, shall determine an applicant's
- 21 eligibility under subsection (a) for exemption from Commonwealth
- 22 agency fees.
- 23 (d) Offenses.--The following shall apply:
- 24 (1) A person who fraudulently obtains a business fee
- 25 exemption commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 26 (2) A person who assigns, transfers or attempts to
- assign or transfer a business fee exemption or uses or
- 28 attempts to use a business fee exemption contrary to this act
- commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 30 (e) Reporting.--The department, in consultation with other

- 1 Commonwealth agencies, shall annually determine the total number
- 2 of business fee exemptions applied for and issued and the total
- 3 dollar amount of the exemptions under this act and submit a
- 4 report to the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 5 Community, Economic and Recreational Development Committee of
- 6 the Senate and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 7 Commerce Committee of the House of Representatives. The report
- 8 may be submitted electronically.
- 9 Section 4. Effective date.
- 10 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
