## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in legislature, further
- providing for legislative districts and for Legislative
- 4 Reapportionment Commission.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby resolves as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The following integrated amendments to the
- 8 Constitution of Pennsylvania are proposed in accordance with
- 9 Article XI:
- 10 (1) That section 16 of Article II be amended to read:
- 11 § 16. Legislative districts.
- 12 (a) The Commonwealth shall be divided into 50 senatorial and
- 13 203 representative districts, which shall be composed of compact
- 14 and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population as
- 15 practicable[.], with a maximum deviation from the ideal
- 16 population of 10% except that a lower deviation may be
- 17 established under section 17.
- 18 (b) Each senatorial district shall elect one Senator, and
- 19 each representative district one Representative.

- 1 (c) Unless absolutely necessary to meet the equal population
- 2 <u>requirement of subsection (a)</u>, no county, city, incorporated
- 3 town, borough, township or ward shall be divided in forming
- 4 either a senatorial or representative district.
- 5 (d) No election district may be divided in forming either a
- 6 senatorial or representative district.
- 7 (2) That section 17 of Article II be amended by adding a
- 8 subsection to read:
- 9 § 17. Legislative Reapportionment Commission.
- 10 \* \* \*
- 11 (c.1) In addition to the requirements of section 16, the
- 12 <u>following shall apply:</u>
- 13 (1) The commission may establish a maximum deviation from
- 14 the ideal population of less than 10% for senatorial districts
- 15 <u>if the lower deviation will not cause more counties, cities,</u>
- 16 incorporated towns, boroughs, townships or wards to be divided
- 17 than would be divided under a plan with a maximum deviation of
- 18 <u>10%.</u>
- 19 (2) The commission may establish a maximum deviation from
- 20 the ideal population of less than 10% for representative
- 21 districts if the lower deviation will not cause more counties,
- 22 cities, incorporated towns, boroughs, townships or wards to be
- 23 divided than would be divided under a plan with a maximum
- 24 deviation of 10%.
- 25 \* \* \*
- 26 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 27 Assembly of these proposed integrated constitutional amendments,
- 28 the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 29 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 30 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the

- 1 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 2 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 3 passage of these proposed integrated constitutional amendments.
- 4 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of these
- 5 proposed integrated constitutional amendments, the Secretary of
- 6 the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 7 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 8 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 9 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 10 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 11 these proposed integrated constitutional amendments. The
- 12 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall submit these proposed
- 13 integrated constitutional amendments as a single ballot question
- 14 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
- 15 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 16 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 17 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 18 three months after the proposed integrated constitutional
- 19 amendments are passed by the General Assembly.
