## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), entitled "An act relating to health care; prescribing the powers and duties of the Department of Health; establishing and providing the powers and duties of the State Health Coordinating Council, health systems agencies and Health Care Policy Board in the Department of Health, and State Health Facility Hearing Board in the Department of Justice; providing for certification of need of health care providers and prescribing penalties," in licensing of health care facilities, providing for access to long-term care nursing facilities for essential caregivers.
12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. The act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known
15	as the Health Care Facilities Act, is amended by adding a
16	section to read:
17	Section 822. Access to long-term care nursing facilities for
18	essential caregivers.
19	(a) Protocols The department, in consultation with the
20	Department of Human Services, shall establish protocols to allow
21	a resident of a long-term care nursing facility or an individual
22	with decision-making authority for the resident to designate an

- 1 individual as the resident's essential caregiver during a
- 2 declaration of disaster emergency. An essential caregiver shall
- 3 meet the necessary qualifications to enter the long-term care
- 4 <u>nursing facility to provide in-person physical or emotional</u>
- 5 support to a resident of a long-term care nursing facility in
- 6 <u>accordance with the protocols established under this section.</u>
- 7 The protocols shall include all of the following:
- 8 (1) Safety measures for an essential caregiver,
- 9 <u>including</u>, but not limited to, restrictions on travel,
- 10 <u>enhanced testing for communicable diseases and the necessary</u>
- 11 <u>safety equipment required to protect the health and safety of</u>
- the residents of the long-term care nursing facility.
- 13 (2) Procedures to replace an essential caregiver due to
- 14 <u>necessary circumstances, including illness or death of the</u>
- 15 essential caregiver.
- 16 (3) A duration, not to exceed 30 days, when a long-term
- 17 care nursing facility may enter a lock-down phase for the
- 18 purpose of establishing safety measures for residents of the
- 19 long-term care nursing facility and essential caregivers.
- 20 (b) Additional safety requirements.--
- 21 (1) A long-term care nursing facility may establish
- 22 additional safety requirements to protect the residents of
- 23 <u>the long-term care nursing facility if the requirements meet</u>
- 24 all of the following criteria:
- 25 (i) The requirements are directly linked to a
- declaration of disaster emergency.
- 27 (ii) The requirements are not so burdensome and
- onerous as to substantially prevent an essential
- 29 caregiver from being able to physically or emotionally
- 30 support a resident of the long-term care facility in

- 1 person.
- 2 (2) After a replacement essential caregiver has been
- 3 <u>named by a resident of a long-term care nursing facility, a</u>
- 4 long-term care nursing facility may suspend access to the
- 5 <u>long-term care nursing facility for an essential caregiver</u>
- 6 who violates the protocols established under subsection (a).
- 7 (c) Personal protective equipment. -- A long-term care nursing
- 8 <u>facility may require an essential caregiver to provide personal</u>
- 9 protective equipment for himself or herself or assume the cost
- 10 of the personal protective equipment provided by the facility to
- 11 <u>allow the essential caregiver to provide in-person physical or</u>
- 12 <u>emotional support.</u>
- 13 (d) Applicability. -- This section shall apply for the period
- 14 commencing 15 days after a declaration of disaster emergency and
- 15 60 days after the termination or expiration of the declaration
- 16 of disaster emergency by executive order, proclamation or
- 17 operation of law.
- 18 (e) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 19 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 20 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 21 "Declaration of disaster emergency." A disaster emergency
- 22 declared by the Governor under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to
- 23 general authority of Governor).
- 24 "Essential caregiver." An individual, whether a family
- 25 member or friend of a resident of a long-term care nursing
- 26 facility, who is designated by the resident or appointed by an
- 27 <u>individual with decision-making authority for the resident to</u>
- 28 provide physical or emotional support to the resident during a
- 29 declaration of disaster emergency.
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
