12	correctional facility of any person whom the board is given the
13	power to parole under this chapter, shall consider:

2	§ 6140.1. Corrections officer statement, testimony and
3	participation in hearing.
4	(a) Duty to provide statement or testimonyA corrections
5	officer who has care, custody and control of an inmate under
6	consideration for parole shall provide a written statement to
7	the board or testify to the board regarding the conduct of the
8	<u>inmate while in prison.</u>
9	(b) Notice of statement or testimonyWithin 30 days of
10	receiving notice that an inmate is being considered for parole,
11	<u>a corrections officer shall submit a written statement or notify</u>
12	the board of the correction officer's intent to testify in
13	person as required under subsection (a).
14	(c) CompensationA corrections officer who provides a
15	written statement or testifies to the board as required under
16	subsection (a) shall do so during the course of that corrections
17	officer's regular employment and shall be compensated at the
18	same rate that the corrections officer would be compensated for
19	conducting the corrections officer's regular duties.
20	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
