## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of February 2019 as "Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Teen dating violence is widespread, affecting
- 4 individuals, families and school communities; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Teen dating violence includes physical, emotional
- 6 and sexual assault as well as harassment via texting, e-mail or
- 7 instant messaging; and
- 8 WHEREAS, On average, violent behavior among young people
- 9 begins between 12 and 18 years of age; and
- 10 WHEREAS, A recent National Youth Risk Behavior Survey has
- 11 reported that, among students who dated or went out with someone
- 12 in the past year, 8% of high school students experienced
- 13 physical dating violence and nearly 7% of high school students
- 14 experienced sexual dating violence; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Female high school students are three times more

- 1 likely than male students to be victims of sexual dating
- 2 violence; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Female college students and women between 16 and 24
- 4 years of age have the highest per capita rate of intimate
- 5 partner violence; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Teen dating violence and abuse can have long-term
- 7 effects on individuals and families; and
- 8 WHEREAS, As a public health issue, teen dating violence and
- 9 abuse affects government programs; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Individuals involved in violent relationships have
- 11 higher risks for substance abuse, eating disorders, risky sexual
- 12 behavior, further domestic violence and suicide; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Most young people never report instances of violence
- 14 or abuse, making it important that parents know the warning
- 15 signs; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Checking cell phones, e-mails or social networks
- 17 without permission, exhibiting extreme jealousy, insecurity or
- 18 possessiveness, being isolated from family and friends and
- 19 telling someone what they can and cannot do are common warning
- 20 signs; and
- 21 WHEREAS, National hotlines, cell phone apps and other
- 22 educational resources inform young men and women and parents
- 23 about teen dating violence and abuse; and
- 24 WHEREAS, RapidSOS Haven is an emergency communication app
- 25 that enables a discreet 911 alert and provides a GPS location
- 26 with the tap of a button; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Seek Then Speak is a mobile app that offers help and
- 28 information to survivors of sexual assault in 30 different
- 29 languages; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The Love is Not Abuse iPhone app is an educational

- 1 resource for parents to learn about teen dating violence and
- 2 abuse; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Organizations that provide direct services include
- 4 the National Teen Dating Abuse 24-hour Helpline and Break the
- 5 Cycle, which support young people in building healthy
- 6 relationships and creating a culture without abuse; and
- 7 WHEREAS, To prevent the serious personal and social effects
- 8 of teen dating violence and abuse, residents of this
- 9 Commonwealth must raise awareness and end the silence
- 10 surrounding this significant public health issue; therefore be
- 11 it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 13 month of February 2019 as "Teen Dating Violence Awareness and
- 14 Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
