A RESOLUTION

- 1 Congratulating The Pennsylvania State University IFC/Panhellenic
- Dance Marathon (THON) for raising more than \$10 million for
- the Four Diamonds Fund at Penn State Hershey Children's
- 4 Hospital to help fight pediatric cancer.
- 5 WHEREAS, THON is the commonly referred-to name for The
- 6 Pennsylvania State University IFC/Panhellenic Dance Marathon,
- 7 the largest student-run philanthropy event in the world; and
- 8 WHEREAS, THON is a yearlong fundraising and awareness
- 9 campaign to fight pediatric cancer, sustained by more than
- 10 16,500 volunteers who donate over 5 million hours of their own
- 11 time, that culminates in a 46-hour dance marathon in which
- 12 dancers are required to be continuously moving and not allowed
- 13 to sit or sleep; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In 1977, THON partnered with the Four Diamonds Fund

- 1 at Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital and chose Four
- 2 Diamonds as the sole beneficiary of THON's fundraising efforts;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, Four Diamonds offsets the cost of treatment that
- 5 insurance does not cover, including medical and emotional
- 6 support to ensure that all of a child's needs are met, and
- 7 supports the medical team that cares for the children; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Four Diamonds funds pediatric cancer research
- 9 through start-up grants and the Four Diamonds Pediatric Cancer
- 10 Research Center and cares directly for 500 children with cancer,
- 11 100 of which are children who have been newly diagnosed; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Since 1977, THON has raised more than \$167 million
- 13 to help provide emotional and financial support to the children,
- 14 families, researchers and staff of the Four Diamonds Fund; and
- WHEREAS, THON 2019 took place February 15 through 17, 2019,
- 16 at the Bryce Jordan Center at The Pennsylvania State University;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, THON 2019, Shape the Moment, revealed its total
- 19 fundraising amount of \$10,621,683.76; and
- 20 WHEREAS, THON has inspired similar events and organizations
- 21 across the United States, including at high schools and
- 22 institutions of higher education, and continues to encourage
- 23 students throughout the nation to volunteer and stay involved in
- 24 great charitable causes in their communities; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Since its introduction, THON has supported over
- 26 4,000 children and families with childhood cancer and to this
- 27 day continues to enable research and improve treatments, cures
- 28 and benefits to ensure the cure of children with cancer around
- 29 the world; therefore be it
