## A RESOLUTION

- Designating April 28, 2019, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in 2
  - Pennsylvania in memory of workers killed, injured and
- disabled in the workplace and in recognition of the efforts
- of the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council and the 12th annual 4
- local "Workers' Memorial Day" program and candlelight vigil 5
- service.
- 7 WHEREAS, Every year in America, a great number of workers are
- killed as a result of workplace injuries and occupational 8
- 9 diseases; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Federal Bureau of Labor and Statistics has
- 11 reported that 5,147 workers suffered fatal injuries in the
- 12 workplace in 2017; and
- 13 WHEREAS, In 2015, 173 Pennsylvania workers lost their lives
- 14 due to fatal accidents in the workplace; and
- 15 WHEREAS, While the official "National Workers' Memorial Day"
- is celebrated annually on April 28, the Greater Wilkes-Barre 16
- Labor Council and other concerned residents are determined to 17
- prevent these tragedies with a local observation of "National 18

- 1 Workers' Memorial Day," as a day to remember these victims of
- 2 workplace injuries; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Through the local observance of this day, the
- 4 Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council renews efforts to seek
- 5 stronger safety and health protections, better standards and
- 6 enforcement and fair and just compensation and improve the
- 7 health and safety of every American workplace; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
- 9 28, 2019, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania in memory
- 10 of workers killed, injured and disabled in the workplace and in
