A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the National Coalition of 100 Black Women on their
2 tireless efforts in recognizing and visibly promoting gender
3 and racial equity and the Pennsylvania chapters of the
4 Coalition of 100 Black Women for the work they do in this
5 Commonwealth.

6 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women,
7 established in 1970, has consistently promoted leadership
8 development and gender equity in the areas of health, education
9 and economic empowerment; and

10 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women
11 consistently seeks and develops alliances with those in
12 leadership from corporate, civic, political and governmental
13 entities to build consensus among special interest groups; and

14 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women, as an
15 organization of career-minded women, both professional and
16 volunteers, draws upon the strength of its membership to work
17 toward solutions on issues of concern for all Black women; and

1 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women is a
2 national organization with longevity and structure that is able
3 to attract and mobilize Black women who want to make a
4 difference in their communities; and

5 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women has
6 consistently demonstrated its ability to bridge the gap between
7 all its members, young, seasoned and wise, and has worked
8 collaboratively with other Black organizations to bridge
9 generational gaps as well; and

10 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women has
11 garnered thousands of members, and established 60 chapters
12 representing 28 states, nationwide; and

13 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Coalition
14 of 100 Black Women was established in 1981; and

15 WHEREAS, Each chapter of the National Coalition of 100 Black
16 Women is committed to empowering Black women and girls to take
17 action in their communities and make a difference on issues that
18 impact the present and future; and

19 WHEREAS, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women is
20 structured for action and committed to being a united voice for
21 more than 20 million Black women in the United States; therefore
22 be it
