INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35,
MAY 8, 2019

A RESOLUTION

1 Designating May 23, 2019, as "National Guard Day" in
2 Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, In 1747, Benjamin Franklin organized the Associators
4 of Philadelphia; and

5 WHEREAS, Units of today's Pennsylvania National Guard trace
6 their lineage to the first Associators; and

7 WHEREAS, In 1755, the General Assembly of the Province of
8 Pennsylvania received a great number of petitions from the
9 several counties of the province "setting forth, That the
10 Petitioners were very willing to defend themselves and their
11 Country, and desirous of being formed into regular Bodies for
12 that Purpose, instructed and disciplined under proper Officers,
13 with suitable and legal Authority"; and

1 WHEREAS, Responding to these petitions, the representatives
2 of the Province of Pennsylvania, meeting in General Assembly,
3 passed this Commonwealth's first militia law on November 25,
4 1755; and

5 WHEREAS, The Militia Act, passed "for the better Ordering and
6 Regulating such as are willing and desirous to be united for
7 Military Purposes within this Province" created the volunteer
8 militia and laid the legal foundation for the militia and the
9 Pennsylvania National Guard; and

10 WHEREAS, Enactment of the act of November 25, 1755, marked
11 the beginning of more than 260 years of cooperation and support
12 from the General Assembly for the Pennsylvania militia, the
13 Pennsylvania National Guard; and the soldiers and airmen who
14 proudly serve this Commonwealth and this nation; and

15 WHEREAS, In war and in peace, Pennsylvania National Guard
16 soldiers and airmen have served at home and abroad and have
17 responded to floods, blizzards and other emergencies at home;
18 and

19 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's National Guard force reaches from the
20 Joint Force Headquarters located at Fort Indiantown Gap, Lebanon
21 County, to nearly 90 communities across this Commonwealth; and

22 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard is one of the top 10
23 employers in this Commonwealth; and

24 WHEREAS, Approximately 3,600 Pennsylvania National Guard
25 members serve in a full-time capacity; and

26 WHEREAS, The remaining 15,000 Pennsylvania National Guard
27 members serve as traditional part-time members who train while
28 pursuing civilian education or careers; and

29 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard is one of the
30 largest National Guard forces in the nation; and

1 WHEREAS, The 28th Infantry Division is the oldest
2 continuously serving division in the United States Army; and

3 WHEREAS, The 213th Regional Support Group is the Pennsylvania
4 National Guard's second major army unit that handles combat
5 support missions, including transportation, finance and
6 personnel services; and

7 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Air National Guard is comprised of
8 the 111th Attack Wing for air support and MQ-9 Reaper ground
9 control, the 171st Air Refueling Wing for worldwide aerial
10 refueling and the 193rd Special Operations Wing for specialized
11 aerial broadcasting missions; and

12 WHEREAS, In time of war, national or state emergency, or in
13 support of any military operation worldwide, the President of
14 the United States may mobilize units of the National Guard into
15 active Federal service; and

16 WHEREAS, The active Federal service of the Pennsylvania
17 National Guard has included engagement in every conflict this
18 nation has faced, from the Revolutionary War through Operation
19 Enduring Freedom, and in peacekeeping missions around the globe;
20 and

21 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard in peacetime offers
22 broad support to the civilian community through the Pennsylvania
23 Counterdrug Joint Task Force (CJTF); and

24 WHEREAS, CJTF has provided trained personnel and specialized
25 equipment to assist State and local law enforcement agencies in
26 disposing of more than 66,410 pounds of drugs with an estimated
27 street value of more than \$37.9 million in the fight against the
28 use of illegal drugs; and

29 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania National Guard members serve as role
30 models as well as community volunteers and civic leaders

1 throughout this Commonwealth; and

2 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard's outstanding
3 performance was on display in 2017 when more than 988 soldiers
4 and airmen provided support for hurricanes Harvey, Irma and
5 Maria, Winter Storm Stella and operation Erie winter storm; and

6 WHEREAS, In the last year, the Pennsylvania National Guard
7 activated roughly 1,756 troops who spent more than 5,730 days on
8 State active duty missions, including winter storm and hurricane
9 response and other domestic operations; and

10 WHEREAS, After more than a decade of sustained high-tempo
11 combat operations, the Pennsylvania National Guard continues to
12 fight overseas and support regional domestic missions; and

13 WHEREAS, With approximately 36,751 individual deployments
14 since September 11, 2001, the Pennsylvania National Guard is one
15 of the busiest and most heavily deployed National Guards in the
16 United States; and

17 WHEREAS, This year's theme, "We Are Pennsylvania," pays
18 tribute to our citizens, soldiers and airmen of the Pennsylvania
19 National Guard; and

20 WHEREAS, We honor these men and women for their dedication
21 and service which has led to the distinction of Pennsylvania
22 having one of the most successful National Guards across our
23 great country; and

24 WHEREAS, The continued support of the General Assembly
25 remains critical to the success of the Pennsylvania National
26 Guard; therefore be it

27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 23,
28 2019, as "National Guard Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further

29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the men
30 and women of our armed forces for their dedicated service to

1 this Commonwealth and this nation and commend them for the
2 outstanding performance of their duties around the world, in the
3 Global War on Terror and in response to natural disasters; and
4 be it further

5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives give thanks for
6 the Pennsylvania National Guard and the service of generations
7 of soldiers and airmen from across Pennsylvania from our days as
8 a proprietary colony to the great Commonwealth we are today; and
9 be it further

10 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
11 the Governor and to the Adjutant General.
