## A RESOLUTION

Designating May 15, 2019, as "Pennsylvania Arson Dogs Appreciation Day" in Pennsylvania and honoring all fire and 2 law enforcement investigative agencies for their dedicated and tireless service. 4 WHEREAS, The National Fire Protection Association estimates 31,000 intentionally set structure and vehicle fires occurred in 7 2017, resulting in a combined 280 civilian deaths and a total of 8 \$657 million in property damage; and 9 WHEREAS, According to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, 10 there were 33,660 arson cases reported with an average dollar loss of \$15,572 per incident in 2017; and 11 12 WHEREAS, An accelerant detection canine, also known as an 13 arson dog, is a dog trained to sniff out minute traces of 14 accelerants that may have been used to start a fire; and 15 WHEREAS, Arson dogs go through extensive training before 16 becoming certified accelerant detection canines; and 17 WHEREAS, Each arson dog is part of a team that is comprised

- 1 of the canine and its handler, a law enforcement officer trained
- 2 to investigate fire scenes; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Not only are these teams trained to investigate the
- 4 causes of fires, they are responsible for providing community
- 5 outreach programs and educational seminars on fire prevention
- 6 and safety; and
- 7 WHEREAS, An arson dog saves time and money by using fewer but
- 8 more accurate evidence samples, reducing expenditures at the
- 9 lab, speeding up investigations and providing a higher
- 10 conviction rate; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Arson dogs can smell more than 100 times better than
- 12 humans and are trained to sniff out more than 60 ignitable
- 13 petroleum-based hydrocarbons; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives pays tribute to the
- 15 contribution arson dogs make to fire departments, law
- 16 enforcement agencies and communities in the conduct of public
- 17 service and safety missions; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 15,
- 19 2019, as "Pennsylvania Arson Dogs Appreciation Day" in
- 20 Pennsylvania and honor all fire and law enforcement
- 21 investigative agencies for their dedicated and tireless service.
