## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Rejecting white nationalism and white supremacy.
- 2 WHEREAS, A 2018 study by the Center for Strategic and
- 3 International Studies found that in the United States the threat
- 4 from white supremacist groups appears to be rising, specifically
- 5 against government, racial, religious and political targets; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A 2006 Federal Bureau of Intelligence (FBI)
- 7 assessment defined a white supremacist as follows: "White
- 8 supremacists believe that the white race is superior to all
- 9 other races and was created to rule them. They view non-whites
- 10 as subhuman and usually refer to them in derogatory terms"; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The same 2006 FBI intelligence assessment defined a
- 12 white nationalist as follows: "To be a white nationalist is to
- 13 be pro-white. The domestic white nationalist movement seeks to
- 14 promote, honor, and defend the white race. They believe the
- 15 white race is under attack from Jewish interests that dominate
- 16 the government (referred to as the Zionist Occupied Government,
- 17 or ZOG), the media, banking, and entertainment industries and

- 1 act to the detriment of the white race. White nationalists view
- 2 multiculturalism, diversity, and illegal immigration as direct
- 3 assaults on the white race and race-mixing as akin to white
- 4 genocide. They hope to appeal to mainstream whites, believing
- 5 that the majority of white people do not understand the imminent
- 6 or long-term threat to their race. Many contend that a race war,
- 7 often referred to as RAHOWA, or Racial Holy War, is a
- 8 certainty"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, White supremacy and white nationalism are contrary
- 10 to the ideals of this Commonwealth, including the belief of our
- 11 founder, William Penn, that Pennsylvania should be "the seed of
- 12 a nation" that stands for fairness, religious tolerance,
- 13 acceptance and representative government; therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives reject white
- 15 nationalism and white supremacy in all its hateful forms and
- 16 express that the values espoused by those supporting white
- 17 nationalism and white supremacy are contradictory to the values
- 18 this Commonwealth was founded upon.
