1 2 3 4	Designating the month of June 2019 as "Cancer Survivors Recognition Month" in Pennsylvania and honoring all cancer survivors for their strength and courage in the face of this devastating illness.
5	WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that there
6	will be 1,762,450 new cases of cancer diagnosed in the United
7	States in 2019; and
8	WHEREAS, As a result of advances in early detection and
9	treatment, cancer has become a curable disease for some and a
10	chronic illness for many others; and
11	WHEREAS, A cancer survivor is anyone living with a history of
12	cancer from the moment of diagnosis through the remainder of
13	life; and
14	WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society and the National Cancer
15	Institute estimate that 15.5 million Americans with a history of

1 cancer were alive in January 2016; and

2 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network 3 reported in 2016 that there were 711,240 cancer survivors in 4 this Commonwealth; and

5 WHEREAS, A cancer survivor can be your parent, child, 6 grandparent, family member, friend, coworker or neighbor; and 7 WHEREAS, Cancer survivorship has three distinct phases: 8 living with cancer, living through cancer and living beyond 9 cancer; and

10 WHEREAS, Survivorship can be both stressful and hopeful; and 11 WHEREAS, Surviving cancer can leave a host of problems in its 12 wake; and

WHEREAS, Physical, emotional and financial hardships often persist for years after diagnosis and treatment; and WHEREAS, Many cancer survivors are deeply grateful to their caregivers, family, friends, health care providers and communities for their love, dedication and support as they battle cancer; and

19 WHEREAS, Despite the fear, challenges and setbacks, life 20 after a cancer diagnosis can be meaningful, productive and even 21 inspiring and triumphant; therefore be it

22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 23 month of June 2019 as "Cancer Survivors Recognition Month" in 24 Pennsylvania in celebration of life; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor all cancer survivors and urge all residents to pause and honor those who are living with a history of cancer for their strength, courage and inspiration.
