A RESOLUTION

Directing the Joint State Government Commission to establish an 2 advisory committee to conduct a study on challenges individuals with disabilities face when traveling within this 3 Commonwealth and determine supports needed to accommodate 4 individuals with disabilities when traveling within this Commonwealth. 6 7 WHEREAS, Travel and tourism make up an important sector of this Commonwealth's economy, with more than 200 million visitors traveling to or within the State every year, moving about from 10 place to place for work, personal errands and leisure 11 activities; and 12 WHEREAS, Travelers have a substantial financial impact on 13 this Commonwealth, spending more than \$40 billion, supporting more than 503,000 jobs and generating \$4.1 billion in tax 14 15 revenue for the State and local governments; and 16 WHEREAS, More than 25 million Americans with disabilities 17 have reported travel-limiting disabilities and 3.6 million

Americans with travel-limiting disabilities do not leave their

- 1 homes because they are disabled or housebound; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Seven out of ten individuals with a disability
- 3 reduce their day-to-day travel because of their disability; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Thirty-two percent of individuals with a disability
- 5 are missing and canceling appointments daily due to
- 6 transportation-related difficulties; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Many travelers with disabilities are hesitant to
- 8 travel due to concerns about the availability of support and
- 9 accommodation available to them at their destination or during
- 10 their travels; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) recognizes
- 12 and protects an individual's right to fully participate in all
- 13 aspects of society, including the right to travel, if the
- 14 individual has a disability; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 16 State Government Commission to establish an advisory committee
- 17 to conduct a study on challenges individuals with disabilities
- 18 face when traveling within this Commonwealth, including, but not
- 19 limited to, individuals with autism, vision impairments and
- 20 physical disabilities; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the advisory committee investigate how the ADA
- 22 addresses challenges to travel for individuals with disabilities
- 23 and to what extent this Commonwealth's tourism industry can
- 24 improve and accommodate individuals with disabilities; and be it
- 25 further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the advisory committee be composed of
- 27 approximately 20 members with knowledge of and experience with
- 28 individuals with disabilities; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission submit a
- 30 report of the study and recommendations to remedy the current

- 1 issues individuals with disabilities face when traveling within
- 2 this Commonwealth to the House of Representatives no later than
- 3 12 months after the adoption of this resolution.
