A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of September 2019 as "Hunger Action Month" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, September 2019 has been designated as "Hunger Action
- 4 Month" to provide a unified opportunity for communities in the
- 5 United States to focus attention on the persistent problem of
- 6 domestic hunger and mobilize efforts to help end hunger in
- 7 America; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture gathers
- 9 information and provides statistics related to domestic hunger;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, According to a study published by Feeding America,
- 12 in 2017, approximately 12.5% or 1.6 million Pennsylvanians,
- 13 including 439,340 children, did not always know where they would
- 14 find their next meal; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvania households experience hunger, and
- 16 some people in these households frequently skip meals or eat too

- 1 little, sometimes going without food for a whole day; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Research shows that preschool and school-age
- 3 children who experience severe hunger have higher levels of
- 4 chronic illness, anxiety, depression and behavioral problems
- 5 than children receiving a well-balanced diet; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Food-insecure senior citizens have lower nutrient
- 7 intakes than food-secure senior citizens and, without proper
- 8 nutrients, senior citizens are at increased risk of disability,
- 9 deteriorated health conditions, decreased resistance to
- 10 infections, lengthened hospital stays, deteriorated mental
- 11 health and being underweight; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The costs of other essentials, such as home heating,
- 13 housing and medical care, have increased significantly and, for
- 14 families caught in the squeeze between declining wages and
- 15 rising costs, the food budget becomes a frequent pressure point;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, Utilization of emergency food assistance becomes a
- 18 way for these individuals and families to keep food on the table
- 19 while still paying the bills; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania food banks serve approximately 2
- 21 million people annually, including more than 482,000 children
- 22 and more than 246,000 senior citizens; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Individuals, charities, businesses and government
- 24 all have a role to play in getting food to those in need; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Food banks, food rescue organizations, soup
- 26 kitchens, food pantries, faith-based organizations, businesses
- 27 and individuals are donating time, raising funds and giving food
- 28 to help their neighbors; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians benefiting from the nutrition
- 30 assistance programs and services range from infants and toddlers

- 1 to school-age children and adolescents to single parents, two-
- 2 parent families, veterans and their families, people with
- 3 disabilities and senior citizens; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 5 month of September 2019 as "Hunger Action Month" in
- 6 Pennsylvania.
