## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of October 7 through 13, 2019, as "Mental Health Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mental health is part of an individual's overall
- 4 health; and
- 5 WHEREAS, One in five adults experience a mental health
- 6 problem in any given year; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Approximately one-half of individuals who have a
- 8 chronic mental illness develop signs by 14 years of age; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Approximately three-quarters of individuals who have
- 10 a chronic mental illness develop signs by 24 years of age; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the
- 12 United States and the second leading cause of death among young
- 13 adults; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Ninety percent of people who die by suicide have an
- 15 underlying mental illness; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Decades-long delays can occur between the first
- 17 appearance of symptoms of a mental illness and the time when an
- 18 individual seeks treatment; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Early identification and treatment can make a
- 2 difference in successful management of mental illness and
- 3 recovery; and
- 4 WHEREAS, It is important to maintain mental health and learn
- 5 the symptoms of mental illness in order to seek treatment when
- 6 needed; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Every individual and each community in this
- 8 Commonwealth can make a difference in ending the silence and
- 9 stigma that has long surrounded mental illness and discouraged
- 10 people from seeking treatment; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Public education and civic activities can further
- 12 promote mental health awareness and improve the lives of
- 13 individuals and families affected by mental illness; therefore
- 14 be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 16 week of October 7 through 13, 2019, as "Mental Health Awareness
- 17 Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize mental
- 19 illness and help fight stigma, provide support, educate the
- 20 public and advocate for equal care; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That all citizens, businesses, schools and
- 22 community organizations be encouraged to take the StigmaFree
- 23 Pledge at www.nami.org/stigmafree in conjunction with this
- 24 observance.
