A RESOLUTION

- 1 Condemning the Trump Administration's proposed changes to 2 eligibility requirements for the Supplemental Nutrition 3 Assistance Program (SNAP).
- 4 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture has
- 5 released a proposal entitled "Revision of Categorical
- 6 Eligibility in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- 7 (SNAP)"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The proposal would restrict states from allowing
- 9 participants who receive minimal Temporary Assistance for Needy
- 10 Families program benefits to be automatically eligible to
- 11 participate in SNAP; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The proposed restriction would leave many American
- 13 families with insufficient funds to purchase food and further
- 14 prevent school children from receiving free lunches; and
- WHEREAS, Approximately 265,000 children who currently qualify
- 16 for free lunches under the program nationwide would become

- 1 disqualified pending the enactment of the proposal; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The proposal's attempt to close a "loophole" that
- 3 helps families with fluctuating incomes, who perpetually
- 4 struggle to buy food, is counterintuitive and detrimental to the
- 5 core objective of safety net programs; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Low-income individuals often struggle with a
- 7 plethora of barriers in finding work; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Stricter work requirements and the elimination of
- 9 food accessibility does not aid low-income individuals in
- 10 finding employment; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The current system allows families to work extra
- 12 shifts without risking the loss of their benefits, which
- 13 encourages individuals to improve their work ethic without
- 14 fearing penalization; and
- WHEREAS, Moving forward with this proposal would quash
- 16 benefits for elderly people and individuals with disabilities;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has a high number of elderly
- 19 residents who rely on food-assistance programs such as SNAP, and
- 20 without these benefits our elderly and disabled populations
- 21 would suffer greatly; and
- 22 WHEREAS, It is an unfortunate reality that individuals with
- 23 disabilities are more likely to live in poverty and experience
- 24 hardships and food insecurity; and
- 25 WHEREAS, SNAP improves health care outcomes for seniors and
- 26 disabled individuals, stimulates the economy and supports jobs;
- 27 and
- 28 WHEREAS, It is the duty of public servants to care and
- 29 provide for disenfranchised populations and make the health and
- 30 welfare of Pennsylvanians a top priority; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives condemn the Trump
- 2 Administration's proposed changes to eligibility requirements
- 3 for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; and be it

- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives demonstrate its
- 6 vehement opposition to the proposal which will harm thousands of
- 7 Pennsylvanians.
