A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the week of April 11 through 17, 2020, as "Week of
2 the Young Child" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, The National Association for the Education of Young
4 Children (NAEYC) is celebrating "Week of the Young Child," April
5 11 through 17, 2020; and

6 WHEREAS, NAEYC works to improve early learning opportunities
7 that are crucial to the growth and development of young children
8 and build better futures for children in this Commonwealth and
9 throughout the United States; and

10 WHEREAS, "Week of the Young Child" is an annual celebration
11 sponsored by NAEYC to highlight early learning, young children
12 and their teachers and families; and

13 WHEREAS, The purpose of "Week of the Young Child" is to focus
14 public attention on the needs of young children and their
15 families and recognize the early childhood programs and services
16 that meet those needs; and

1 WHEREAS, NAEYC first established "Week of the Young Child" in
2 1971, recognizing that the early childhood years, from birth
3 through eight years of age, lay the foundation for children's
4 success in school and later in life; and

5 WHEREAS, "Week of the Young Child" is a time to plan how
6 individuals can better meet the needs of all young children and
7 their families; and

8 WHEREAS, All young children and their families deserve access
9 to high-quality early education and care; therefore be it

10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
11 week of April 11 through 17, 2020, as "Week of the Young Child"
12 in Pennsylvania; and be it further

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
14 residents of this Commonwealth to work to make a good investment
15 in early childhood education in their local communities, across
16 this Commonwealth and this nation; and be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
18 support the people, programs and policies that are committed to
19 high-quality early childhood education as the right choice for
20 young children.
