## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Encouraging members of the General Assembly to convene public
- hearings to receive testimony from medical professionals
- regarding the appropriate standards of care for children with
- 4 gender dysphoria.
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2017, the General Assembly passed House Bill No.
- 6 1388, Printer's No. 1749, which reauthorized the Children's
- 7 Health Insurance Program (CHIP) under section 2309-A of the
- 8 Insurance Company Law of 1921; and
- 9 WHEREAS, As part of the discussion regarding the
- 10 reauthorization of CHIP, an amendment was proposed to House Bill
- 11 No. 1388, Printer's No. 1749, to limit the use of State tax
- 12 dollars to provide care under CHIP for gender transition
- 13 services for children with gender dysphoria; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In 2017, separate legislation was also proposed to
- 15 specifically address the issue of providing care under CHIP for
- 16 gender transition services for children with gender dysphoria;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, While considering the issue, members of the General
- 19 Assembly deliberated about the appropriate standards of care for

- 1 children with gender dysphoria, including the proper terminology
- 2 to use when referring to children with gender dysphoria; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Members of the General Assembly have not received
- 4 testimony from medical professionals regarding the appropriate
- 5 standards of care for children with gender dysphoria; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Members of the General Assembly would acquire a
- 7 better understanding of the appropriate standards of care for
- 8 children with gender dysphoria by receiving testimony from
- 9 medical professionals who specialize in child health care;
- 10 therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage members
- 12 of the General Assembly to convene public hearings to receive
- 13 testimony from medical professionals regarding the appropriate
- 14 standards of care for children with gender dysphoria.
