A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the month of March 2020 as "Problem Gambling
- 2 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and recognizing the month of
- March 2020 as "National Problem Gambling Awareness Month."
- 4 WHEREAS, Individuals across this country and in this
- 5 Commonwealth enjoy the recreational aspects of legalized
- 6 gambling; and
- 7 WHEREAS, For some individuals and families, gambling becomes
- 8 an issue affecting and disrupting their lives; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The National Council on Problem Gambling reports
- 10 that 2% to 3% of the United States population, or between 6
- 11 million and 9 million Americans, will have a gambling problem in
- 12 any given year; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Problem gambling is a public health issue affecting
- 14 individuals of all ages, races and ethnic backgrounds in every
- 15 community; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Gambling has a significant societal and economic
- 17 cost; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Treatment for problem gambling is effective in
- 2 minimizing the harm to individuals, families and society; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Only a limited number of individuals affected by
- 4 problem gambling seek treatment options and utilize existing
- 5 treatment programs; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Numerous individuals, professionals and
- 7 organizations have dedicated their efforts to public awareness
- 8 of problem gambling and the availability and effectiveness of
- 9 treatment; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The proliferation of unregulated slot machine-like
- 11 devices in nearly every community across this Commonwealth,
- 12 especially in vulnerable communities, is contributing to
- 13 gambling addiction; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Unregulated gambling devices demand increased focus
- 15 on compulsive and problem gambling awareness and the education
- 16 of residents of this Commonwealth on gambling addiction as a
- 17 public health issue, which affects Pennsylvanians of all ages
- 18 and backgrounds; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The National Council on Problem Gambling is
- 20 coordinating the annual "National Problem Gambling Awareness
- 21 Month" campaign in March to educate the public about the impact
- 22 of problem gambling and the availability of treatment options;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 25 month of March 2020 as "Problem Gambling Awareness Month" in
- 26 Pennsylvania and recognize the month of March 2020 as "National
- 27 Problem Gambling Awareness Month"; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 29 Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board to continue its outreach
- 30 efforts and work with the Pennsylvania gaming industry to

- 1 develop and implement problem-gambling programs and further
- 2 promote community-based programs in this Commonwealth; and be it
- 3 further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 5 Department of Health, in conjunction with the Department of Drug
- 6 and Alcohol Programs, the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board and
- 7 individuals, professionals and organizations dedicated to public
- 8 awareness and treatment of problem gambling, to jointly create,
- 9 develop and promote public awareness campaigns regarding the
- 10 recognition and prevention of problem gambling; and be it
- 11 further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize that
- 13 problem gambling is a public health issue impacting residents in
- 14 this Commonwealth in a harmful way which must be addressed in a
- 15 reasonable and responsible manner; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all
- 17 residents of this Commonwealth to learn more about problem
- 18 gambling and the programs available to help individuals and
- 19 their families who have been adversely affected by this issue.
